BONES OF HISTORIC RIVER

Anthropologists intensely interested in Discovery of Indian Skeletons in California.

New indications that California was once inhabited by a race of gigantic Indians was furnished when sewer diggers on Ferry and Howard streets, in the heart of the business district of Martinez, Cal., uncovered an Indian burial ground, with skeletons measuring more than seven feet.

Several skulls and one well-preserved skeleton are to be given over to the investigators of the anthropology department of the University of California. The skulls and skeletons are declared to be of highly important and scientific value.

Discovery of the burial ground has revived an old Indian legend that an immense treasure of gold nuggets was interred with a body of a chief of the ancient tribe of the giant Indians. So convinced are the residents in the truth of this legend that great crowds have thronged around the sewer diggers, largely hampering their activities, and more than a score of persons have applied to the local authorities for positions on a sewer-digging crew.

As to the ancient Indian treasure, the vast gold treasure was discovered in the vicinity to where the sewer-digging crew was working.

Two years ago William Alfman, the museum in Golden Gate Park, San Francisco, declared that he had unearthed near Convent a valuable contribution to the scientific investigation of the

Hudson. By the river was never known in his life to him, even during the brief time in which he was in the service of the Netherlands East India Company, for he knew scarcely a word of the Dutch language, and he insisted upon having the Dutch lawyers drawing up at Amsterdam the Dutch contract with the company, write therein his name in its plain English form--Henry Hudson, says the New York Tribune.

That he is called Hendrick is due to a whim of the "gentle-humorist," Irving, who in the posthumous papers of the mythical Diedrich Knickerbocker naturally and appropriately used the Dutch form of the name.

Animals Waves. Investigation has been made of the peculiar wavy motion of centipedes and millipedes, with the view of determining the manner in which these animals manage to use their superabundant pedal extremities so gracefully and harmoniously. It is found that the legs move in groups, or waves, each wave including a definite number of legs. The number of waves included in the length of the body is constant for each species. In millipedes the waves of each side are synchronous; in centipedes they are symmetrically alternate, giving rise to beautifully accordant movements. The difference may be explained by suggesting that the millipede moves like a pacing horse, the centipede like a trotter.

Gladstone Explains His First Budget. We owe to the late duke of Argyll an account of the cabinet meeting in 1853 at which Mr. Gladstone, then forty-three years of age, explained the proposals of the first of his series of famous budgets. "He came into the room," writes the duke, "with a large, flat, shallow official box, very old and shabby, covered with drab-colored leather. He sat on a chair nearby fronting the window, whilst we all sat in a kind of loop around him. Opening the box on his knee, so that its lid stood upright and afforded a rest for any paper placed upon its edge, he began a conversational exposition, which endured, without a moment's interruption, for more than three hours." The speech in which Mr. Gladstone laid this budget before the house lasted about upon five hours.
