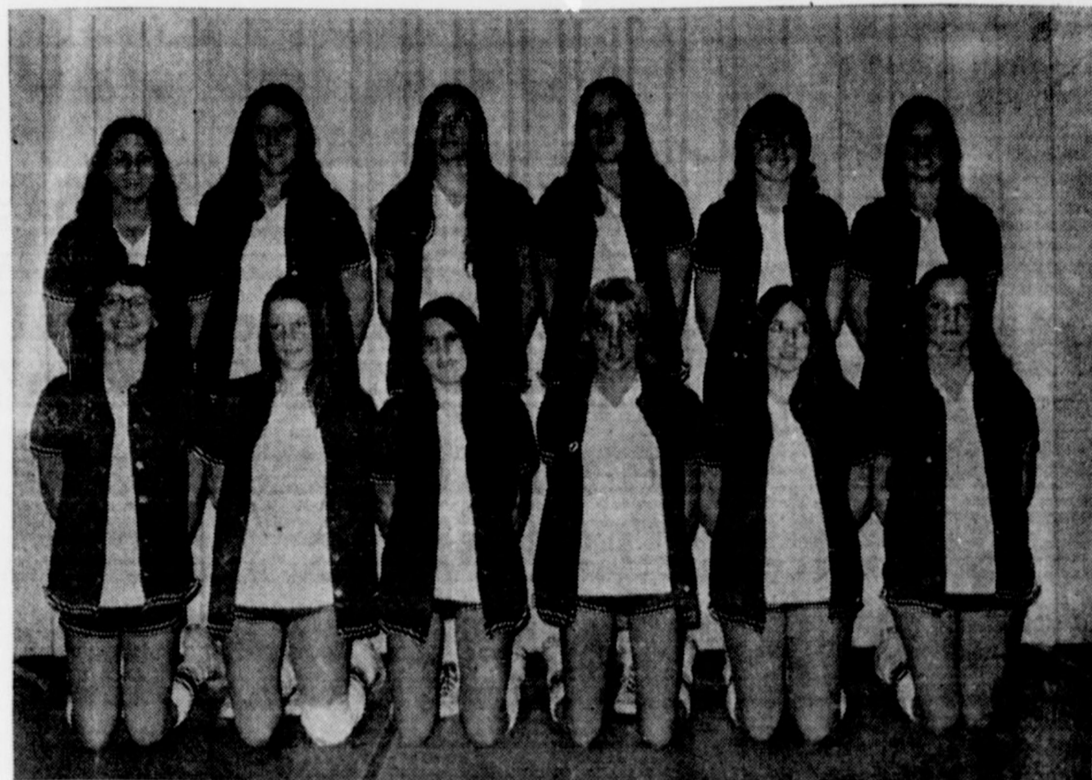
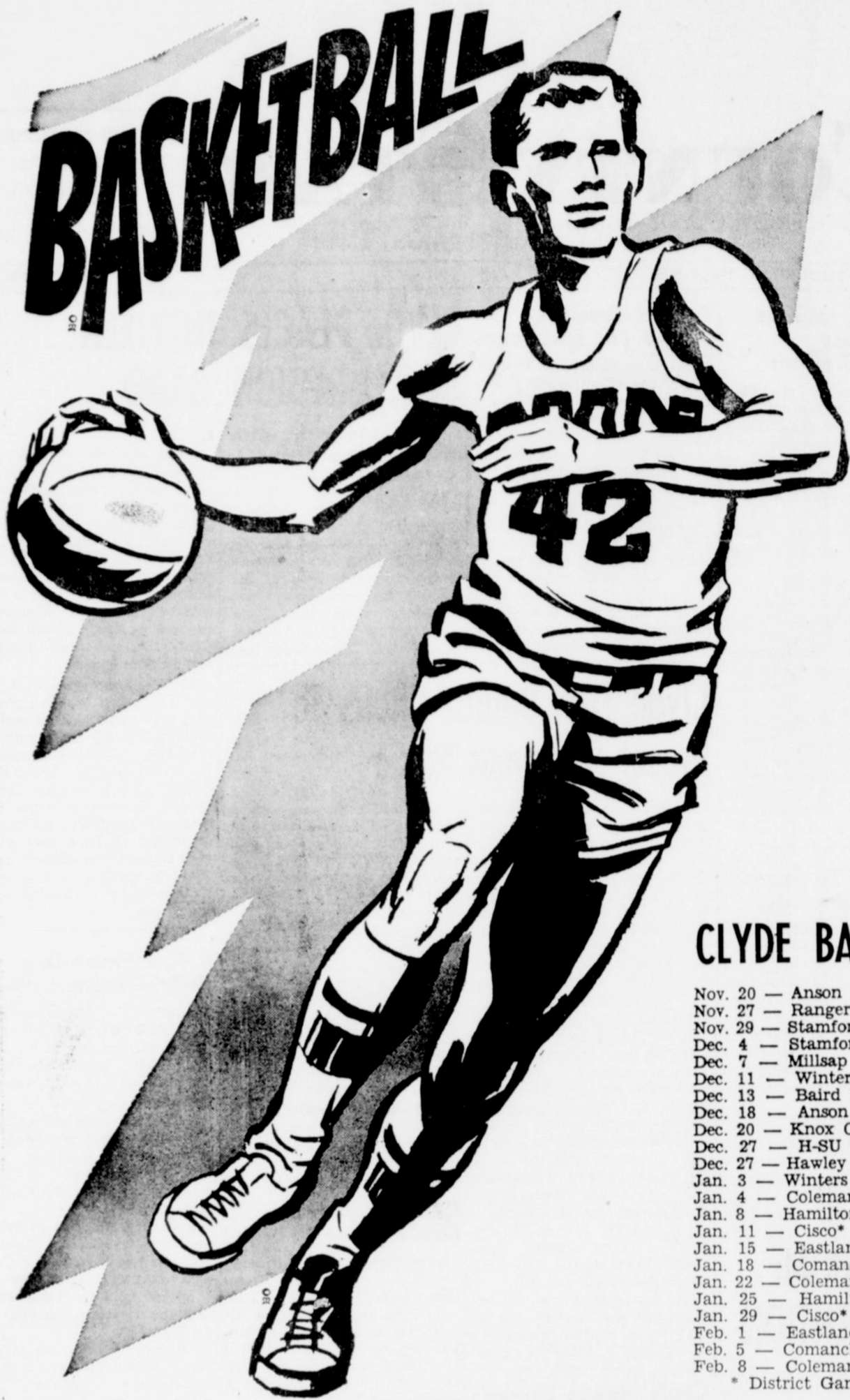
## Fomer Clyde Resident Buried at Eula



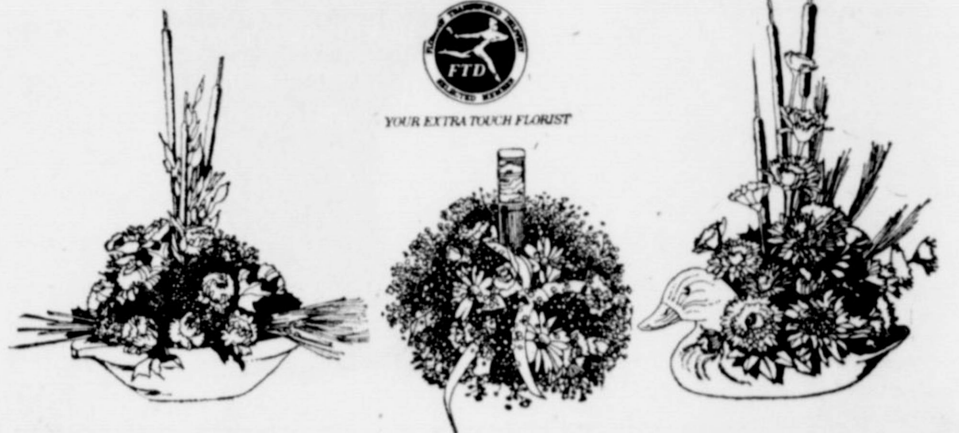

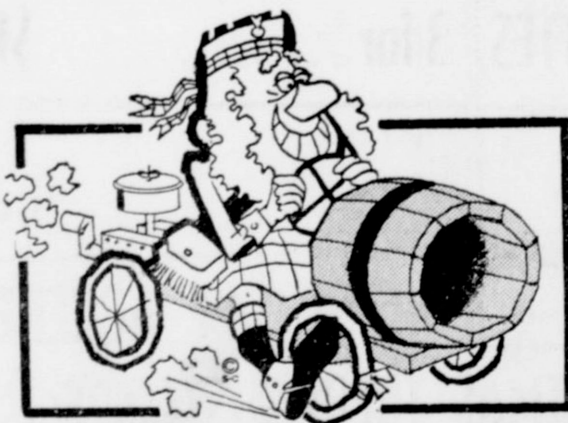
