> If your soldier is en soute home or about to come home, send him a Christmas package. Use his latest address and be sure it's complete and accurate; name, rank, serial number, organization and unit, APO, in care of Postmaster at port of embarkation. Address it-then check it.

Mail Christmas gifts overseas from September 15 to October 15. In the Army, this is the only time you can mail a parcel over seas without a written from your soldier. But, if there is a reason to believe he may move to a new location, it's safer to wait till you can mail your gift to the new address even if this means asking him for a let-
