## Rep. Nabers Seeking Re-Election To State Legislature, 55th District

BROWNWOOD — State Representative of Brownwood has announced that he will be a candidate for re-election to the State Legislature from the 55th district which includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, McCulloch and Rannels Counties. He is presently completing his sixth year as State Representative from this area.

In announcing his decision, Nabers said, "I appreciate the opportunity to serve in this capacity and I will continue to uphold integrity in government and work for ethical standards designed to restore confidence and respect in our entire legislative process." He also stressed that he will continue to support legislation favoring economy in state government and establishing priorities in public spending to give taxpayers the best services for their tax dollars.

Nabers is a practicing attorney and has farming and ranching interests in Brown County. He received a B. S. degree from Howard Payne College and a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from Baylor University in 1967.

In the past six years Rep. Nabers has served on the State Affairs, Criminal Jurisprudence, Conservation and Reclamation, Insurance and Youth Committees. He served as Chairman of the very active Public School Financing Interim Study Committee and was named to the House Standing Committee on Revenue and Taxation. Nabers was a member of an interim group selected to adopt guidelines and make recommendations in the vital areas of water, conservation and reclamation. He was Chairman of an interim committee to study agreements in the petroleum industry and worked on committees to study insurance revisions throughout the state. He is presently Vice Chairman of the Criminal Jurisprudence Committee and has held the Chair-

manship of the Youth Committee.

Most recently Nabers served as Chairman of the Sub-Committee for the revision of the Texas Penal Code. He has been recognized for his work in helping pass a Tuition-Equalization Bill and has been actively working to bring Vocational-Technical Training Schools to this area.

This past year Rep. Nabers was honored by the Texas Bar Association for outstanding work during the past legislative session and just recently was named Distinguished Alumni of Howard Payne College.

Nabers is a partner in the Day and Nabers Law Firm in Brownwood. He has been elected President of the Brown County Bar Association for 1974. He is married to the former Mary Scott of Cross Plains and Mrs. Nabers is the current President of the Texas State Representative Wives Association. The couple have two sons, Scott age 9 and Tim, age 4.

## Two Area Youths To Participate In Houston Calf Scramble Friday

HOUSTON — Wayne Barr of Clyde and Chris Vestal of Baird will participate in the 1974 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Calf Scramble at the matinee performance Friday, Feb. 22nd.

Since its inception in 1942, the Calf Scramble has paid youngsters well over \$1 million to buy more than 7,000 calves to feed and develop. The purpose of the calf scramble is to encourage and further educate 4-H Club and FFA boys in the raising, feeding and breeding of high quality Texas cattle. Only half of the 388 boys taking part in this year's scramble will come out winners.

As the fourth event of each 1974 rodeo performance, the calf scramble begins with 24 boys lined up within a square at the center of the Astrodome arena. After the signal is given, the

boys race after 12 calves which have been turned loose nearby. Each boy's objective is to place his halter on a calf and return it to the square. The 12 boys who manage this feat receive \$225 certificates from area businessmen for the purchase of a calf of their choice. Each winner will feed, raise, and care for his animal until next year's show when he will return it for judging in the calf scramble division and junior breeding division.

In addition to the calf scramble, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo is packed with excitement, entertainment and thrills. The show opens Feb. 20 and runs through March 3. Top professional cowboys from throughout the United States and Canada will be competing for the world's richest rodeo purse - over \$100,000. Nine great entertainers are scheduled to appear at the rodeo: The Jackson 5, Feb. 22; Sonny and Cher, Feb. 23 & 24; Johnny Rodriguez, Feb. 25; Charlie Rich, Feb. 26; Doc Severinsen and Today's Children, Feb. 27; Tony Orlando and Dawn, Feb. 28; Conway Twitty, March 1; Vicki Carr, March 2; and Elvis March 3. There's someone for everyone.

## Marc Gilmore Dies From Blast Injuries

CLYDE — Marc Kent Gilmore, 24, a Clyde Volunteer Fireman, injured in the Feb. 11 explosion that killed three other men and injured two, died about 8:30 p. m. Tuesday in Hendrick Memorial Hospital.

Gilmore had been listed in critical condition, suffering from first degree to third degree burns over 25 percent of his body, and multiple fragmentation wounds from the blast.

Doctors had amputated Gilmore's left leg below the knee shortly after the accident, and operated again Thursday to remove metal fragments.

Gilmore was a graduate of Clyde High School, and had been employed as a mechanic with Check Chevrolet in Baird until his injury.

His wife is the former Brenda Cutbirth of Clyde.

Funeral arrangements are pending with Bailey Funeral Home in Clyde.

## Two Held In Jail For Cattle Theft

## Immunization Clinic At Clyde School

CLYDE — There will be an Immunization Clinic at the School Cafeteria March 7, from 1:30 to 3:30 p. m. The clinic is free and will be for any student now enrolled in school or for any one who will be enrolling next year.

All children who will be in Kindergarten or First Grade next year are urged to complete shot records early. The school will send home Immunization notices within the next week stating the necessary boosters for each child now enrolled.

State law requires the following immunizations:

Polio - At least 3 doses of oral vaccine, provided one or more doses have been received since the fourth birthday.

Diphtheria - Tetanus - Minimum of 3 doses, with at least one dose having been received since the fourth birthday. (Usually given at DPT for children less than 6 years of age, and TD for children 6 years of age and older).

Measles - 1 dose of vaccine, or history of measles illness.

Rubella - 1 dose of vaccine. Not required past age 12 years.
