Born November 23, 1889, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Eli Gilliland, he attended school in Baird. He was a partner in a furniture business, and operated a plumbing and sewer system for Koek & Fowler before going into the plumbing business he operated until his death.

He married the former Stella Mitchell in Baird in August 1921. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, a member of the Baird Masonic Lodge No. 522 for 46 years, and was given a life membership in 1956. He was a Master Mason and Shriner of the Fort Worth Temple.

Mr. Gilliland was elected to the Baird City Council in April of 1957, and was serving in this position at the time of death. He is survived by his wife, Stella of the home; one daughter, Mrs. John P. Allen of Grand Prairie; one brother, Bill Gilliland of Dallas; one sister, Mrs. Lynwood Hayes of Clifton; two grandsons, John P. A Longview soldier, 1st Lt. Don Mitchell, grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Charlie Brandon of Baird, and a nephew of Mrs. Foy Jobe of Putnam, recently participated in a search mission which uncovered three sizeable caches of enemy weapons and equipment, in Vietnam.

The two-day mission through an enemy basecamp and storage area, near Chon Thanh, uncovered 900 82mm mortar shells, 900 hand grenades and 900 one-quarter pound blocks of TNT.

Two caches were located the first day of the search. The third and largest of the bunkers was located on the second day and contained 300 boxes of 88mm mortar rounds with three rounds to a box, and 150 one-quarter pound blocks of TNT, with everything in the bunker being neatly stacked. This led Lt. Mitchell to believe his platoon had run into an organized enemy supply area.

After Lt. Mitchell handed the boxes out of bunkers to other men in the platoon, the cache was destroyed by a demolition team.

Lt. Mitchell is a graduate of Shattuck High School in Fairbault, Minn. He graduated from OCS at Fort Benning, Ga. in Sept. 1967. Following special training in air-to-ground missiles and a two-week jungle training course, conducted in Panama, Lt. Mitchell spent a five day leave in Longview with his parents, leaving for Vietnam on Sept. 28.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. W. Mitchell reside in Longview and his wife, the former Cathy Allen of Crockett, is a student at Mary Hardin-Baylor College.

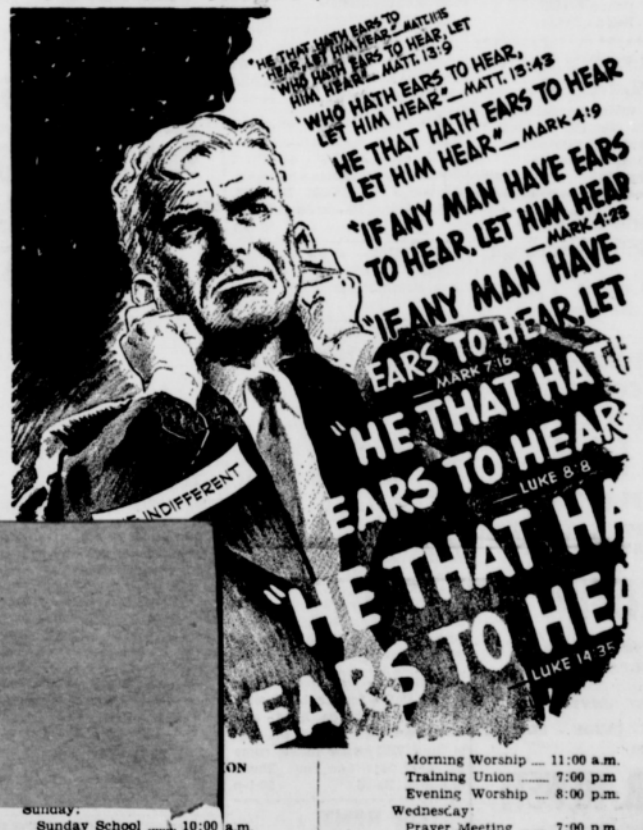
