CENSUS SHOWS RAPID INCREASE OF WHITE RACES OVER BLACKS

Census reports for the last 3 decades show an interesting ratio in the increase of population in the south as regards white races and the negroes. In the decade of 1890-1900 the whites increased 50 per cent faster than the black, and in the next decade from 1900-1910 the ratio became even greater than double over the blacks. While the last census from 1910 to 1920 shows that the white races have gained in population more than ten times as fast as the negroes. This has a tendency to prove that the negroes like the Indians cannot stand the pressure of modern customs or withstand the ravages of modern diseases. The race question in the south at one time gave the appearance of a real menace but like other vexing problems that would not respond to scientific treatment, it is being slowly solved by economic process. As disappearing as it may seem at present, the negroes will in the long years of the future gradually succumb to the genius and prowess of the superior races and will disappear like the red man of the plains.

SEAL ALWAYS WORK OF ART

Almost Everywhere Stones of Peculiar Beauty Were Chosen for These Marks of Identification.

Seals and their impressions, whether antiquarian or recently made, have always stimulated the fancy of the connoisseur and art student by their charming effect and the ingenuity displayed in putting so much on so small a space. The use of the seal for the identification of objects by making a unique and inimitable mark upon them was adopted in early times by nations. We know from the Old Testament that the ancient Jews had them in use, and recall the dialogue between Judah and Tamar in Genesis 38:18, which says: "What pledge shall I give thee?" to be answered with, "Thy signet and thy bracelets." This signet was probably similar to those used in ancient Egypt, a cylinder of hard stone, engraved with a personal device. There are many such in the British museum.

In Egypt the impression of a seal was usually taken in Nile mud and attached to documents. Later on among the Latin races seals were used for legs of money, documents and even private rooms and were impressed in wax. The delight which the ancients always had in bright and sparkling objects led to the choice of hard transparent stones of peculiar beauty which lend themselves to engraving, and so it is that the attracted the attention of those engaged in producing lovely little works of art.
