HEAVY RAINS CONTINUE, GROUND DEEPLY SOAKED

Last Friday and Saturday showers visited this vicinity and in some places made moisture meet causing some who were fortunate enough to be in the path of the showers to feel rather lucky. Little did we realize that these showers were to be followed by a series of the heaviest rains that has visited this section of country. On Sunday night a general rain fell amounting to 2 inches or more. It proved to be only a beginning compared to what we have seen for us on Monday and Tuesday nights. Monday evening the heaviest amount each from 9 to 12 inches and on Tuesday about 4 to 6 inches. Again Saturday clouds formed in the afternoon and another heavy rain making the fourth in this area which has given us an abundance of moisture, if it is not considerably more than that feature of the season.

SUCCESSFUL SQUAB RAISING

Birds Must Be Kept Free From Disease and Insect Parasites—Keep House Clean.

There is very little chance of making money from squabs, unless the pigeons can be kept comparatively free from disease and insect parasites, pigeon specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture point out. If healthy breeding stock is obtained, the houses and yards kept clean, and careful attention given to the birds, diseases and parasites should not be a troublesome factor in squab raising. The stock should be carefully watched and any sick birds removed.
