HEALTH HINTS FOR WARM WEATHER BY STATE DEPT.

Hot weather and digestive upsets go together. We call such upsets "summer complaint" with good reason. Hot weather favors the growth of germs and the decay of milk and other foods. It also lowers the power of the body to digest food which it could thrive on in winter. The most important rule for keeping well in summer is not to overtax the digestion. Special care should be taken not to eat foods which have undergone decomposition. Such food is one of the commonest causes of summer diarrhea. Do not overeat in the summer. If you take more food than the body needs the excess ferments in the intestine, and the products are absorbed and poison the body. Do not eat, or eat very lightly when overtired or very warm. Eat sparingly of meat in summer. Meat foods are particularly harmful when they ferment in the intestine. Meat should not be eaten more than once a day or may well be omitted entirely by all those who are not doing hard physical work. Fish, too, should not be taken more than once a day. In the tropics men eat large quantities of fruits and vegetables. The reason for this is nature's

In all controversies a show-down must finally result. The labor unions are now approaching that crisis. They like all other dominating organizations that find themselves in a little brief power and authority have invited disaster by tackling problems foreign to their interest. An American labor union should not attempt to shape England's Irish policy, and if a few radical Irish leaders in the American union press their efforts much further the union will awake, possibly too late, to the realization that the American people have passed judgment on their order, and its wreckage be strewn beyond repair. The union is now insisting upon a rigid boycott of all British products, even to insurance companies, manufactured articles, etc. That kind of a policy is entirely out of line with the great free spirit and institutions of our liberal government and of course will meet with unsurmountable obstacles before it has proceeded very far. If the American Federation of Labor desires to maintain a laborer's union in the United States they had better keep it out of the boycott business.

W. B. Bizzell, Pres. of the Texas Agricultural and Mechanical College, one of the leading economists and educators of the south; Clarence Ousley of Texas A. & M. College and the Agricultural Section of the United States department of Agriculture; Colonel Ousley is one of the brightest men in Texas, and has during the past given the Texas farmer the sanest advice that has been offered him by any publicist in Texas. Mr. Walter Petzet of the Federal department of Agriculture was a member of this committee Mr. D. E. Lyday Pres. of the Texas Farmers Union was another member. The other members of the committee were representative farmers from over Texas, and were for the most part men of considerable wealth and wide experience in business. This committee consulted with the Texas Bankers Association; The Federal Trade Commission, and with many of the leading business men of Texas. It employed competent counsel to advise it. Among the lawyers consulted was Mr. Ayro Sapiro organizer and general counsel of fourteen of the most successful of the California Fruit Growers Association. A similar committee was at work in many other southern states. The result of the deliberations and consultations of the various committees was the association contract under which the state of Oklahoma has pooled 412,000 bales of cotton for a period of seven years and under which the Texas Farm Bureau is endeavoring to pool one million bales of cotton out of each crop for the next five years for the purpose of doing collectively what the cotton farmer cannot do individually. That is, for the purpose of properly warehousing grading and selling gradually as the spinners need it, the south's great staple cotton.

COTTON DISCUSSION

(Continued from Page 1) of Arkansas and is at present engaged in making a speaking tour of Texas. Clarence Ousley is scheduled to make twenty speeches at leading cotton centers in Texas during the three weeks ending June 7th. Carl Williams editor of the daily Oklahoman and Oklahoma Stockman is on a speaking tour of Texas for the Association. The Dallas Morning News has editorially endorsed the Association. "The very worth move for cooperative marketing now under way in Texas" The Star Telegram has endorsed the movement editorially. These are able men and disinterested men whose only desire is to serve and benefit the farmer. Does not a movement with these endorsements deserve the serious consideration of growers of cotton. Men we have cussed the government and the system long enough. The cotton Association provides a feasible plan a business plan to remedy all that is wrong with the cotton farmer except for those things for which he is personally responsible. The cotton farmer by organizing the Association and making it a success, can do for himself the things he has been howling to have done for him for a generation. After all it is our job no one else can or will do these things for us. Unless they are done we sink in peonage. Are we degenerate sons of worthy sires who are going to content ourselves by grumbling or, are we worthy sons of the men who conquered the wilderness and made America great, capable of solving our own problems, and overcoming our own difficulties? Our answer to this question will be given by the number of bales signed by July the first. Are you afraid? After all it is only for five years and we have sold our labor of our wives and children for sixty years under a system that we know is a failure and must continue to be a failure. GREEN FEEDS FOR CHICKENS

Sprouted Oats, Alfalfa Meal, Chopped Alfalfa, Clover Hay and Beets Are Recommended.

Good kinds of green feeds for hens in winter, recommended by the United States Department of Agriculture, are sprouted oats, alfalfa meal, chopped alfalfa and clover hay, cabbage and mangold beets. Cabbages may be hung up in the poultry house; the beets are usually split and stuck on a nail on the side wall of the pen about a foot above the floor to keep the feed clean. Keep oyster shells, grit, charcoal, and plenty of clean drinking water before the hens all the time.
