WORK OF THE LUNGS.

THE NECESSITY FOR PURE AIR AND PROPER BREATHING.

Respiratory Gymnastics Tend to Strengthen the Resisting Force of Nature to Disease.—The Lesson of the Black Hole of Calcutta.

To my mind the part of the physical man which depends all the possibilities of mental resource is that part which is related to respiration and which for its perfect work depends upon the quality of the air he breathes, the quantity respired and the method thereof. The apparatus for respiration consists of the lungs, the diaphragm, the trachea and the bronchi, the one on the right side having three lobes, the other on the left two lobes. We must always bear in mind that nature is generous in her provisions, and she has given us so much of lung tissue that a large part can be quickly exhausted and become inactive, yet the entire force for its legitimate three years and ten and its duties and activities continue unimpaired by any conscious lack. Under the microscope the lung tissue shows an infinite number of tiny cells or ultimate lobules. Some have estimated there are as many as hundred million, and wonderful to relate, only with the first breath that the infant draws are both lungs ever filled with absolutely new air. All through life there is necessarily what we call a residual air, which may be of a greater or less amount, according to the breathing of the individual. It is said that the extent of surface through which the air breathed passes is approximately 200 square feet, and the excretion from the lungs daily is over two pounds of poisonous matter. It is certain that at least one-third of the waste and poisonous matter caused by the activities of the body is excreted through the lungs.

Unfortunately, a great majority of us breathe in a very impure air, using only part of this large area of lung tissue. Even if persons are out of doors, the air is impure, and deep cells of the lungs are not aerated for the simple reason that very few breathe in a deep manner. Sam Gholson settled in Coleman county in 1869 and was known all along the frontier as a splendid type of the greatest old Texas who drove the Indians out of this country. Dr. S. T. Frazer lived with Sam Gholson in Coleman county along about the 70's and they had long talks over early days on the border. Mr. Gholson went west about twenty years ago to Crosby county then on to Yellow House Creek, and later he moved over into Coleman county, near the Texas line where he now lives. There has been a brother with Sam Gholson, true his one dark raven hair is nearly white, but he still walks straight as an Indian and his bronzed features have never changed one particle. He is 6 feet 3 inches tall, and he sits him with his feet on a chair, but in his last twenty years.

SAN ANTONIO INTERNATIONAL FAIR.

The San Antonio International Fair having its opening date October 19, ending October 30, concerns itself chiefly with the affairs of live stock and agriculture. Under their proper classification farm management and processes, experiments with various crops in different soil, reports from different States and showing the aggregate of crops and products of all kinds; exhibits of all products of farm and garden.

The livestock exhibit will be extensive. Never before have there so many well bred cattle been brought together. Two classes were to attract much attention will be the display of range and beef cattle, for which exceedingly liberal prizes have been offered. Never in the history of the South have there been so many liberal premiums offered in a live stock show. Grand areas exhibit, to be held on six days, will be among the prominent features.

There will be a large display of dairy products, modern machinery and apparatus used in and about the dairy. All the popular exhibits will be displayed in a suitable refrigerating room on the grounds, which will make it possible to have a fresh exhibit daily.

presentation of "Battles of Our Nation," a musical war spectacle portraying the events from the colonial wars to the present date.

The amusement features of the Fair will consist of a vast array. To stray upon a Mid-way of such wonders as is being provided has not been the privilege of those attending Texas Fairs. Two immense Floral shows will take the visitors reveling high above the earth. "The beautiful ornets" will be another attraction. It is described as a dancing, romantic and realistic display of the manifold charms of the East. There will be electric fountains and theaters, dazzling in their brilliant beauty of rainbow colors. In addition there will be "A Trip to the Moon," "War Cyclorama, Cinegraph, Glass Flowers, "Darkness and Dawn," "Animal Show, Dreamland, Moving Pictures, old Nuremberg, Scenic Railway, and many other objects of interest.

Visitors to the San Antonio International Fair will be assured the low fares and the facilities following railroad service in San Antonio and their connections.
