HIGH COST OF EARTHQUAKES Has Been Called On to Expend

In the last 15 years, during which period Italy has been stricken b earthquake 13 times, the Italian gov. erument has spent \$44,600,000 in repairs in the 25 provinces, including more than 1,000 towns and yil lages, which have suffered from the asters. This sum is exclusive of he amounts spent for the reconstruction of public buildings destroyed. In view of the grave condition of the public finances and of the present high cost of materials, the government considers it the part of prudence to limit the budget requests for the continuation of the remated necessary for the building to be accomplished in one year. About fifth of this sum will be used for the building of barracks and cotages to rehouse the populations wie homoless by earthquakes.
