# Some Facts Concerning the Road Bond Issue to Be Voted On August 15

Based upon present renditions, which are approximately \$2,730,238 in this precinct, the tax rate that would be necessary to be levied for the first five years of care for the bond issue now pending would be 39.4 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation.

Based upon the present rendition, the tax rate that would be required to care for the bonds from the 5th to the 11th year would be 36.4 cents on the one hundred dollar valuation.

Based upon the present rendition, the tax rate that would be required to care for the bonds from the 11th to the 16th year would be 32 cents on the one hundred dollar valuation.

Based upon the present rendition, the tax rate that would be required to care for the bonds from the 16th to the 21st year would be 27 cents on the one hundred dollar valuation.

Based upon present valuations, the tax rate that would be required to care for the bonds from the 21st to the 26th year would be 27 cents on the hundred dollar valuation

And, based upon present valuations, the tax levy required after the 26th year until maturity of the bonds at thirty years would be 2 cents on the one hundred dollar valuation.

In each of the preceeding paragraphs it will be noted that the tax levy that would be required for the retirement of the bonds is based upon PRESENT VALUATIONS, when, as a matter of fact, it is a well known fact that the valuations will increase as the years go by, and there is little or no question that the valuations even for next year will justify a material reduction in the rate named in the first paragraph, and like reductions all down through the life of the bonds.

And from the above figures it will be found that the average rate throughout the life of these bonds will be approximately 25 cents on the one hundred doller baluation. This figure too, is based upon PRESENT valuations.

That values will be materially increased even upon the face of next year's renditions may be deducted by reason of the fact that a pipe line has been extended through the precinct and many miles of high-lines have been erected within the precinct, which alone will bring the rendition values up materially over those mentioned above and reduce the tax rate accordingly.

Taking the average rate that would become necessary for the retirement of these thirty-year bonds, together with the land values as they appear on the tax rolls of the county, the issuance of the bonds would mean that lands within this precinct would be taxed to the extent of only THREE AND THREE-TENTHS CENTS PER ACRE.

It has been charged in some quarters

that the bond issue would place a major portion of the burden upon the farm lands of the precinct, which statement is contrary to the facts in the case, as will be shown by the tax rolls, which show land values in precinct to be \$1,138,520, city valuations \$641,340 and personal property \$950,378. hence it will be found that the city and personal values under present renditions exceed land valuations to the extend of \$353,198 under the rendition today, and it is an undebatable conclusion that personal and city values will continue to increase at a more rapid rate than will land values, since all land in the precinct is already assessed for taxation and the only way in which the taxable values may be increased is for a raise to be made either in the rate of valuations, while city and personal values may be increased by expansion and the investment of outside capital in our precinct, which will surely follow the march of progress.

And we believe it is but just to point out the fact that land values in this precinct as rendered for taxation represents about one-fifth the actual value of the land, while city valuations are given in for taxation at approximately one-half their actual value. The average valuation of land as rendered for taxation in this precinct is \$13.00 per acre.

These facts are not pointed out in the spirit of criticism of the land owners, but are mentioned for the reason that it has been charged that the farmers would be burdened with a major portion of taxation incident to the issuance of these bonds, which statement cannot be borne out by figures on the county tax rolls.

It is the desire of this committee to point out facts and figures, for indeed it is only their purpose to present actual facts that can be varified from the most reliable source, and we believe that with these facts before them they will be better qualified to cast their vote in the election to be held August 15th, and in pointing out the divided valuations we merely wish to show that the towns are not asking for a "free ride" at the expense of our farmer friends.

And for further comparison, we will take the average assessed valuation of farm lands in our precinct and see what the actual costs in dollars and cents will be on the farm of 160 acres. At \$13.00 per acre the 160-acre farm will go on the tax rolls at \$2,080, which, at the PRESENT valuation, would cost the owner EIGHT DOLLARS AND NINETEEN CENTS PER YEAR for the first five years, provided our valuations remained the same as they are today, but it would be even less as values increased in the precinct and the indebtedness is reduced.

Would it not be worth \$8.53 to every farmer who owns 160 acres of land to have a hard-surfaced road to the markets of-Wichita Falls and Abilene? Would not every farmer in this precinct realize more

than this amount of benefits by having these two markets compete for their farm products, which could be conveyed to these distributing points at a less cost than at present by reason of these hard-surfaced roads? If farm products can be transported to market at a less cost than under our present road condition of, say, one cent per pound, would it not be reasonable to assume that the one cent per pound would accrue to the producer?

But, the outstanding reason why the citizens of this community should support this bond issue is found in the fast that unless the present issue is voted upon favorably it is an assured fact that a county wide issue will be voted upon the people and this would be for the constitutional limit of approximately \$800,000, and which would only affect the highways of the county.

Should the county-wide bond issue be voted this precinct would receive benefits only on Highway No. 30, which is the only highway traversing this precinct, and for the same benefits that we are to receive in this issue for \$135,000 we would pay approximately \$284,000 in a county-wide bond issue, as the valuations of this precinct represent about 38 per cent of the entire valuations of the county, while we have less than 15 per cent of the highway lying within the county.

Certainly other sections of the county would like to see that precinct issue defeated at the polls, for then they would have opened to them an opportunity to place a heavier burden upon the people of this precinct, and they would derive a greater portion of the benefits.

To this committee this proposition is not a matter of selfishness, for we would be glad to see good roads built in all sections of the county, but since this precinct is in position to receive benefits on only about thirteen miles of such a program and would be taxed to the limit we look upon it as merely a matter of self-protection, and every move that has been made toward the creation of the independent road district has been made with a view of protecting the interests of the people of this section of the county rather than working a hardship on a certain few, as has been charged by some.

And furthermore, should a countywide issue be voted upon the people of this county, it would be necessary to absorb all bond issues outstanding against independent road districts, hence the people of the county as a whole would be called upon to pay the indebtedness that has been incurred by certain portions of the county.

If you, Mr. Citizen, desire to keep your taxes down to a minimum, it is unquestionably to your interest to vote for the precinct bond issue, but if you prefer having the constitutional limit placed upon your property, then cast your vote against this issue.


