She says you may be surprised how little money actually reaches those in need. Cavanagh also says never be pressured into making a donation right then and there. Legitimate charities will

even death as a result of air bags. The most important and immediate message is that children age 12 and under should always ride in the back seat, buckled up either in an appropriate child restraint or the lap/shoulder restraint system in the vehicle.
Drivers, particularly those who are șhort-statured, should wear safety belts with their seats pushed as far back as practical to still safely operate the vehicle. Shortstatured drivers may find that pedal extenders are a viable option. The pedal extenders allow the driver to sit farther back.
