## John Towler Appointed Post Master For Baird Office; Effective Oct. 22

John T. Towler, a resident of Baird since 1937, has been appointed Postmaster for the Baird Post Office, effective last Friday, Oct. 22. He replaces Roy Gilbreath, who was appointed acting postmaster some two years ago.

Towler was graduated from Megargel High School, and attended Abilene Christian College. He moved to Callahan County in 1937, and in 1939 entered postal service as a substitute clerk, under the late Miss John Gilliland.

He served in the Army from Oct. 16, 1942 until Jan. 9, 1946, and overseas duty was in Asiatic Theater of Operations. After his discharge from the Army, he re-entered Postal Service in capacity of a clerk, then seven years as a carrier, serving under the

former Postmaster J. Brice Jones.

In 1955 he transferred from carrier to clerk, and served until Feb. 1965, when he was appointed Assistant to Postmaster, under acting Postmaster Roy Gilbreath.

Mr. and Mrs. Towler, the former Nila Appleton, have three children: Mrs. John Loshier of Abilene, Larry, a senior at Baird High School, and Alan a freshman student.

To insure delivery of gift parcels to loved ones during the Christmas season, the following dates are suggested by the Post Office Department:

Surface mailing to Armed Forces: Oct. 21 through Nov. 10.

Air parcels to Armed Forces: Dec. 1 through Dec. 10.

Domestic to distant states: Mail before Dec. 5.

Domestic to bordering states: Mail before Dec. 14.

Greeting Cards, distant states: Mail by Dec. 10.

Greeting Cards, nearby states: Mail by Dec. 15.

Surface mail to Alaska and Hawaii: Mail by Nov. 30.

Air delivery to Alaska and Hawaii: Mail by Dec. 15.

According to Postmaster John Towler, if these mailing dates are followed, your packages and mail will be received in time for the holidays.

## Seek Survivors Of Pearl Harbor

The military survivors of the attack on Pearl Harbor of Dec. 7, 1941, are trying to perform a miracle by locating as many survivors as is possible in order to band together and form chapters in cities and states across the country as the "Pearl Harbor Survivors Association."

They have oated over 10,000 servicemen and women of all the uniformed military services who were there, and believe that some 40,000 more survivors may still be alive today, and would join if they knew that a National Association of Survivors of Pearl Harbor 1941 had been formed. They are seeking to perform the "Miracle of Survival" which is returning in mass to Honolulu, Hawaii for the 25th anniversary and memorial service at Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1966. All arrangements have been made for this reunions 25 years after the attack.

These amendments are vitally important to every citizen of this county and the State of Texas. Take advantage of this opportunity to express your opinion upon how our State government is run.

The election will be held at The American Legion Hall in Baird.

A brief description of the ten proposed constitutional amendments follows:

Amendment No. 1 — Increasing state ad valorem tax by five cents on the \$100 valuation, to be used for building construction for state institutions

of higher learning. Amends Section 17, Article VII.

Amendment No. 2 — Authorizing an increase of \$200 million in bonds or obligations that may be issued by the Veterans Land Board, extending program eight years. Amends Section 49-b, Article III.

Amendment No. 3 — Providing that the Legislature shall enact appropriate legislation to enable the State of Texas to continue cooperating with the federal government in providing assistance to and/or medical care on behalf of certain aged, needy and handicapped persons, expanding age categories of those eligible for blind assistance and of needy children; and extending eligibility of the program for the aged to citizens of the United States and non-citizens who have resided in the United States for 25 years. Amends Section 51-a and Sub-sections 51a-1 and 51a-2 of Article III, and incorporates them into one section 51a, Article III.

Amendment No. 4 — Authorizing four-year terms of office for the Governor, the Secretary of State, and other state officials elected in statewide elections. Amends Section 4, 22 and 23 of Article IV.

Amendment No. 5 — Clarifying investment authority for the Board of Trustees of the Teacher Retirement System. It amends Article III by adding a new Section 48b, and repeals conflicting authority which exists in Section 48a, Article III.

Amendment No. 6 — Authorizing the Legislature to provide for issuance of bonds to be used in creating the Texas Opportunity Plan Fund as a loan fund for Texas students attending public and private institutions of higher education within the state. Amends Article III, adding a new Section 50b.

Amendment No. 7 — Exempting certain hospitals expending at least \$1.5 million for free care of indigent from the payment of ad valorem taxes levied by any taxing entity except the state itself. Amends Article VII by adding a new Section 2-A.

Amendment No. 8 — Providing for automatic retirement of District and Appellate Judges for old age and creating a State Judicial Qualifications Commission; providing for removal of District and Appellate Judges for misconduct, and for retirement of Judges in cases of disability. Amends Section 1-a, Article V.

Amendment No. 9 — Authorizing the Legislature to set the salaries of the Lt. Governor and the Speaker of the House, and increasing per diem pay of members of the Legislature from \$12 for 120 days to \$20 for 140 days during a regular session and 30 days of each special session. Amends Section 24, Article III, and Section 17, Article IV.

Amendment No. 10 — Providing four-year terms for members of the Texas House of Representatives. Amends Section 4, Article III.



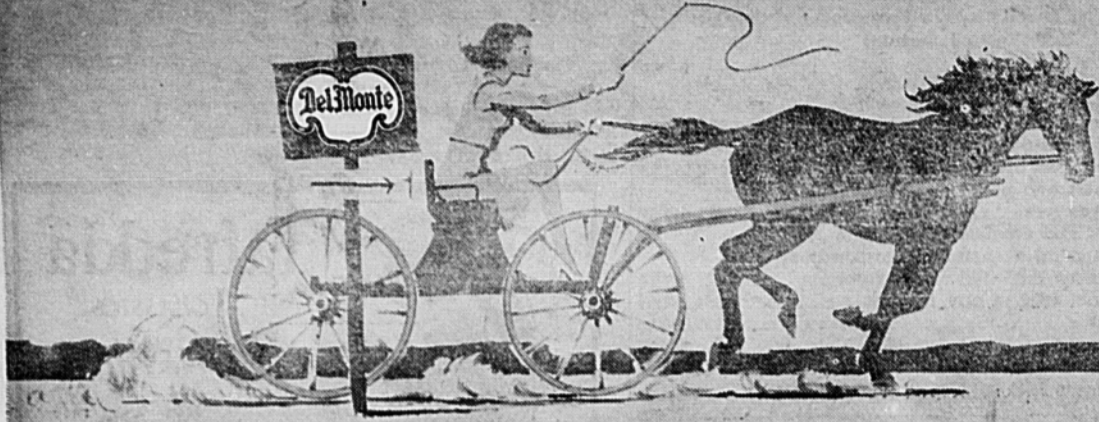
