# "Red Alert" Out as Screwworms **Build Up Across The State**

A "red alert" is being sounded throughout the state as screwworms continue to assault livestock and other animals, 43ys Grieg Gerngross. County Agricultural Agent. Callahan County has not recorded any cases to date, but it's most important that all animals be chocked closely and regularly for infestations.

Weather conditions were favorable for heavy screwworm buildups last winter in northern Mexico as well as in parts of the Southwest. Some infestations were also spread by transporting infested livestock last fall, and the insect pest spent the mild winter in new quarters. This spring overall conditions were "ripe" for a massive screwworm invasion.

According to County Agent, Greg Gergross, more than 2,300 cases have been confirmed in Texas this spring, the earliest and heaviest outbreak in the history of the Screwworm Eradication Program.

Although sterile fly production at the Mission Lab is running at its peak -- 200 million a week -- treatment with these flies is not enough to stop the destructive, flesh-eating livestock producers and owners of other animals (dog, cats) to follow certain precautions:
