

Commissioner's Race Ends In Tie; Corn Wins By "Casting of Lot"

BAIRD — Where else could it happen but in Baird, Callahan County, and in Precinct 1.

Irvin Corn and Tommy Tucker tied in the race for Commissioner of Precinct 1. Each received 825 votes in the runoff election held Saturday, June 3rd.

Callahan County Democratic Executive Committee met Tuesday morning and acted, after checking the laws, and on the advice of Judge Raleigh Brown, on all information concerning a tie vote. The law provides in case of a tie, a term "Casting of Lot," which means that various ways can be used to name a winner. In this case, the flip of a coin was used, and Irvin

Corn was declared the winner of the race.

Mr. Tucker, if he chooses to do so, can file within 10 days with the 42nd District Court, to have a recount of the votes.

Dolph Briscoe received 1,775 in his bid for governor here in the county. Sissy Parenthold had 590 votes; Barefoot Sanders was well over Ralph Yarborough for State Senator with 1,560 to his opponent's 786. A very close race for Lt. Governor resulted here with Bill Hobby receiving 1,196 to Wayne Connolly's 1,137. State Treasurer Robert Calvert received 1,374 votes and James Wilson 863.

Other races in this county have proven interesting in past years. Most recent was the race between Glen Swor and Lowell Johnson for Commissioner of Precinct 4. The total count resulted in only two votes in naming Johnson winner in that race.

These races, like this one, is the best of reasons why we should never say, "My Vote Does Not Count." This race proves that this statement is made with common sense and cannot have meaning for anyone. You can see that every vote counts, because no one knows how an election will turn out.

Mr. Corn and Mr. Tucker are to be commended for the gentleman-like manner in which they conducted their campaigns during the many months of seeking votes.

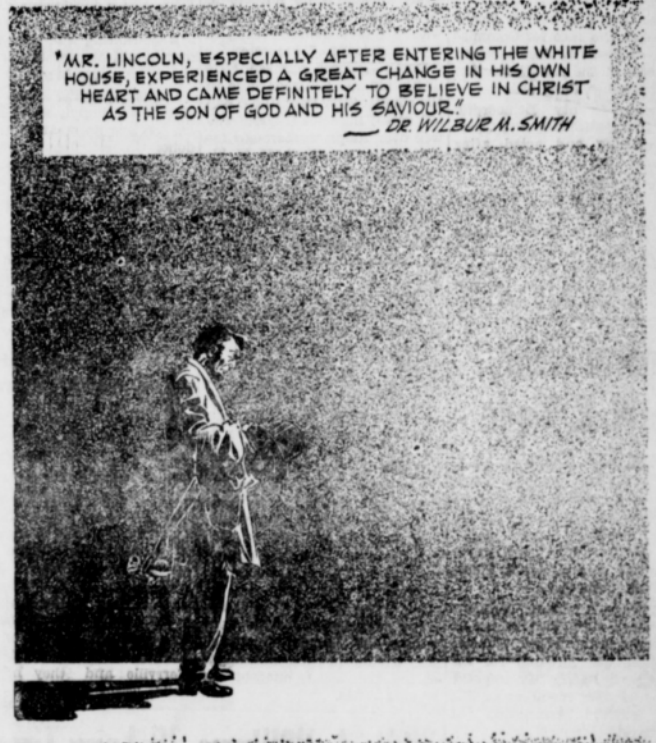
