High School Vandalized Over Weekend \$100 Reward Offered

5 Votes Unseat JP, Democrats Renominate Incumbents

Two incumbent justice of peace were renominated by county democrats only to unseat another by 5 votes in Saturdays primary election.

Lee Savell, incumbent in Precinct 5, was defeated by Deputy Sherriff Jesse Henley. Totals showed Savell to have received 410 votes to Henleys 415.

Voters favored L. P. Mitchell with 201 votes to challenger Eddie Heard's 178. Place 8 incumbent Ida Mae Waddell topped challenger I. G. Mobley, 69 votes to 28 votes.

No Republicans ran in any of the three races.

Curly Hayes defeated Jewell Harris, 734 votes to 577 votes for membership on the State Board of Education, District 17.

WIC Program Needs County Sponsors

WIC, a Federal health program designed to provide food assistance and nutrition education to low-income pregnant and lactating women, is currently soliciting applications for sponsors.

Local or migrant health agencies, community action programs, or neighborhood health clinics, who would like to sponsor a WIC program for their community should contact: Cathy Litteer, R.D., Special Project Director, WIC Program, 1100 West 49th Street, Austin, Texas 78756. Phone 512-458-7632.

Currently, there are 50 local WIC projects in the State, but the program is not available to women, infants, and children in many Texas counties. WIC needs a sponsoring agency in Callahan County.

The WIC Program provides food assistance and nutrition education to low-

income pregnant and lactating women, and children up to five years old, who have been found to be the most vulnerable to the effects of malnutrition.

WIC participants receive a monthly supply of nutritious foods such as milk, eggs, fruit juice, iron-fortified cereal and infant formula.

Monthly nutrition education classes are also provided so that WIC participants can learn about the relationship between health and good nutrition, and how to buy and prepare nutritious meals. The ultimate goal is a positive change in dietary habits that will improve participants' nutritional status. The futuristic nature of the program, training young mothers, who will in turn teach their children good eating habits, has far reaching potential.

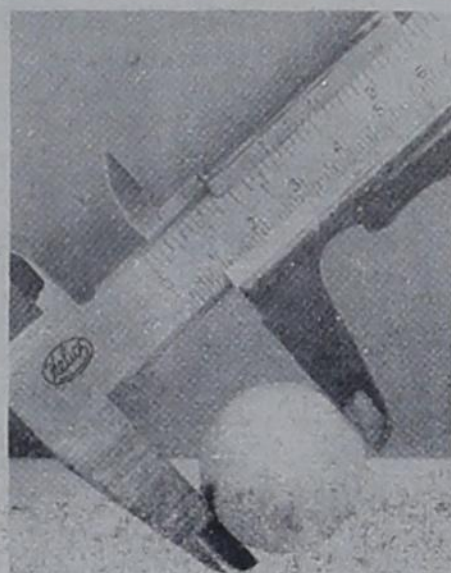
The Baird Chamber of Commerce is making plans for the 4th of July, to be held on the 3rd of July, on the courthouse lawn.

Grant Wins District Medalist, Team Takes 4th

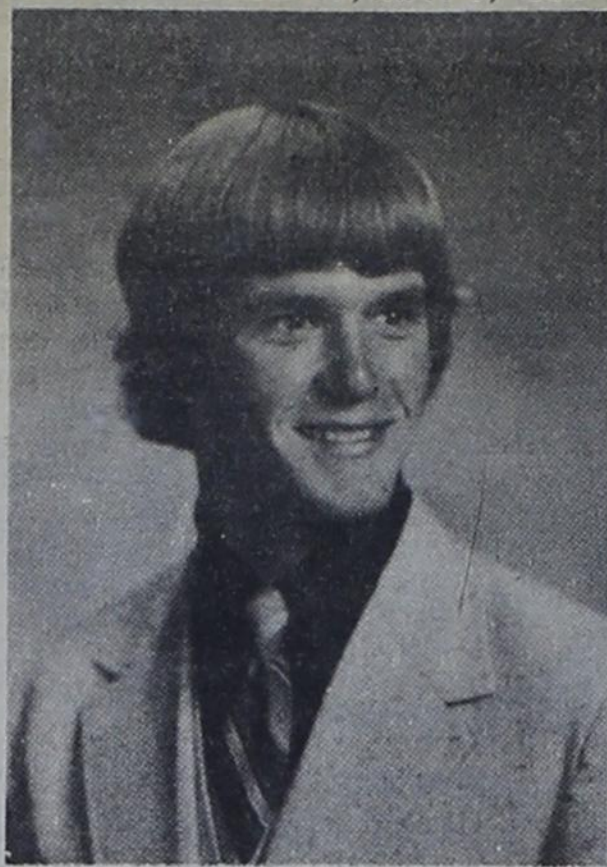
The District Golf Tournament, hosted in Sweetwater, April 27th was attended by the Baird High School Boys Golf Team.

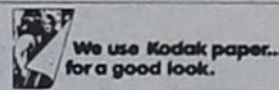

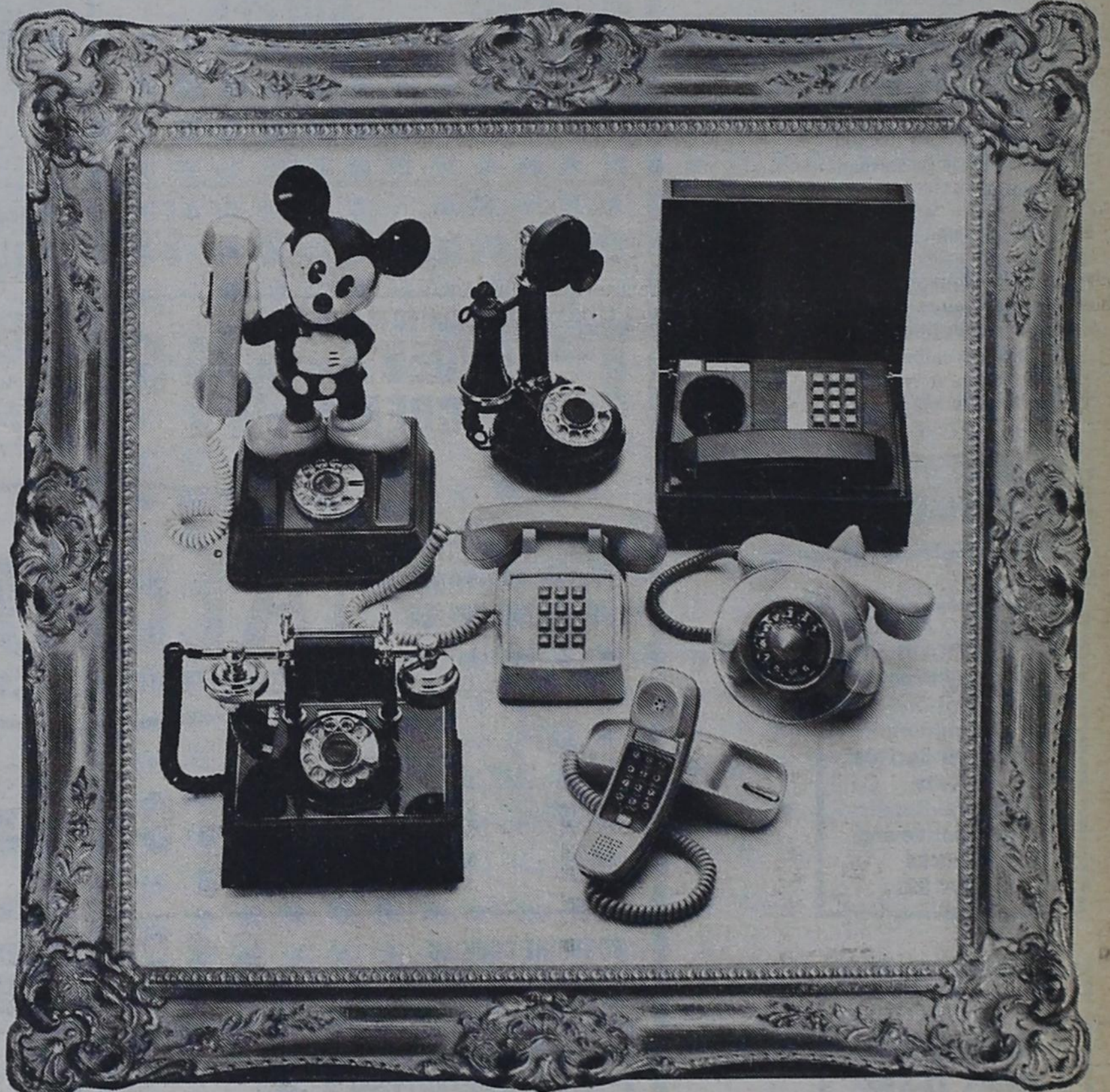

"Farmers Speak Out" Toll-Free May, 11

Policymakers in our nation's capital will hear the facts about conditions in agriculture directly from farmers who telephone them May 11 a "Farmers Speak Out" program.

Organized through the Agriculture Council of America with a grant from Farmland Industries, Inc., farmers, ranchers, farm business operators and anyone else will have the opportunity to call lawmakers and other officials in Washington, D.C. on toll-free telephone lines.

Wilburn Carrico, general manager of the Callahan County Farmers Co-Op,

Baird, indicated that fifty lines will be available from 9 a.m.-9 p.m., CDT. "Anyone wanting to express his opinion on agricultural issues can call 1-800-368-5769," Wilburn said.

The purpose of this "Farmers Speak Out" program is "to dramatize to Washington the depth of farmers' and ranchers' difficulties--and, as importantly, to try to stimulate a broader discussion of feasible remedies. It is not an attack on the administration or anyone else", said Wilburn.

"It is an attempt to find solutions acceptable to a

majority of the interests represented in our government, by discussing these too-long-ignored problems with officials of all background--rural, suburban or urban," Wilburn pointed out.

The telephone lines will be set up in a room in the Cannon House Office Building where members of Congress, their aides, officials of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, officials of other Executive Branch departments and representatives of independent agencies with economic responsibilities will take the calls.

The "Farmers Speak Out" program will be a two-stage blitz. In addition to the telephone calls, there will be a written survey of farm opinion. This survey will measure the seriousness of conditions on U.S. farms and will ask farmers their views on actions they feel can be taken to improve the farm economy.

"Farmers wanting to fill out a survey can stop by the local cooperative and pick up a copy," said Wilburn.

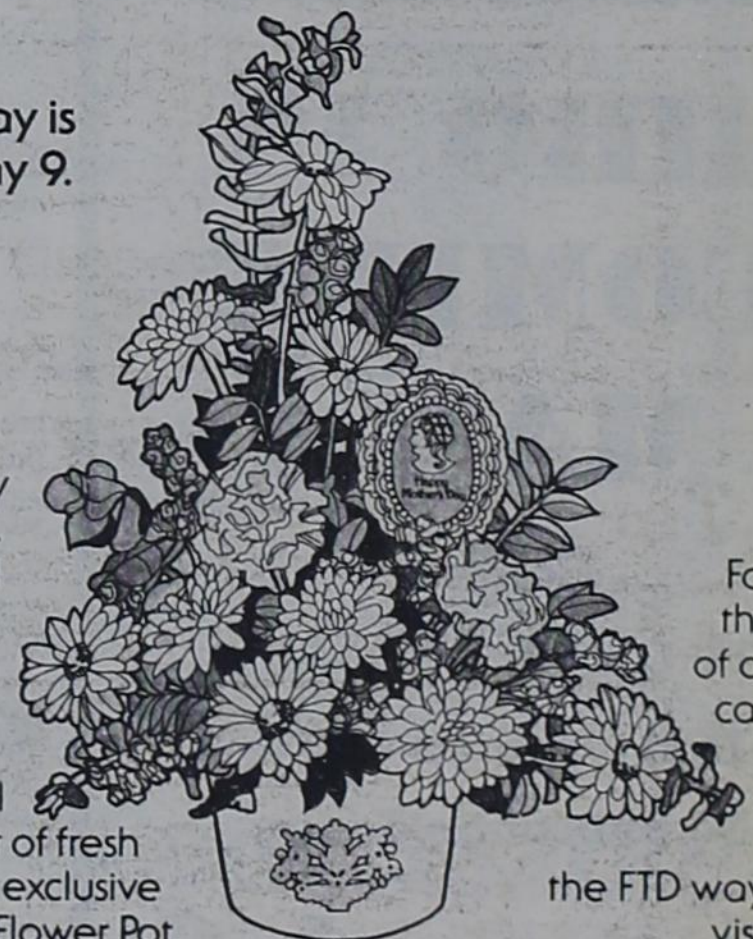

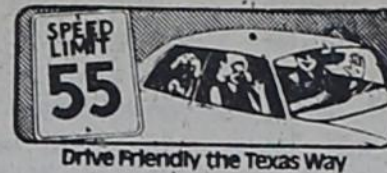
