

Auxiliary Seeks Community Support To Keep Hospital Open

The Auxiliary of the Callahan County General Hospital is urging residents of the county to rally together in an effort to keep the ailing hospital open.

Ladies of the Auxiliary held open house Saturday in conjunction with the 4th of July celebration from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., where approximately 15 tours were conducted of the hospital in order for residents of the community to view hospital facilities.

Since RHMI gave Callahan County Commissioners notice June 16 ending their lease, there has been a wide-spread effort by the Auxiliary and the community to continue the operation of the hospital.

Closing of the hospital could make a critical difference if an injured or sick person had to be transferred to other facilities for medical attention.

Although the hospital lacks having a physician on duty 24 hours a day, the nursing staff is prepared and able to stabilize

a patient while the doctor is enroute. Doctors are on call at all times.

Many simple procedures can be performed at the hospital and it is very important to the that non-medicare residents be aware and utilize these facilities.

Hospital personnel are able to perform simple x-rays and dianostic lab test for upper gastro-intestinal tract problems, gall bladder ailments and kidney disease.

Medicare patients account for 95% of the hospital's caseload, which does not pay the full cost of the patient's confinement. Non-medicare patients using the facilities would bring increased revenue to the ailing hospital.

Callahan County voters will be deciding factor whether county subsidies are made, and commissioners are trying to find a firm to manage the hospital without subsidies.

ISD Board Ask Super To Resign

"Personality conflicts" was the reason cited for Leon Williams, Clyde school district superintendent, to be ask to leave. Williams, whose contract would have expired July 1984, had been superintendent since 1979.

School board members offered Williams \$45,275, or 13 months salary, to terminate his remaining years of his contract. He left his position June 14. He received half the money Thursday and will

receive the other half January 1.

Low morale among personnel by lack of communication between principles and teachers, plus poor custodial maintenance of school grounds, and lack of a teacher planning period during regular school hours were among the reasons board members gave Williams for renegotiating his contract.

Members of the school board are interviewing candiates for the superintendent position at this time.







Andy Williams Featured At Kick-off Banquet



Letter To Editor

Dear Editor:

I'd hate to see the doors close to Callahan County Hospital. I've lived in this county most of my life. My parents, brother and my own family have used it many times. I've been proud that our county has had a nice hospital available for those who needed it.

My husband, John Towler, retired postmaster was seriously ill with cancer and Parkinson Disease for three years. He was in Hendricks five times plus six weeks of colbolt treatments as an outpatient. Last fall the three Specialists we were using agreed that it would be much easier on me if I transfer all his records to Dr. Calvo. They all spoke very highly of our congenial & qualified local doctor. John was in the hospital all the month of January. During the winter months the hospital was full. Not all were on Medicare. We are not on Medicare. I was able to stay with him day and night. I brought him home for three weeks hoping that with the help of Up John Nursing Service I could take care of him.

His condition grew worse and I had to put him back in the hospital. He went in as an emergency patient. We were settled in a room within 30 minutes. He could not have made the trip to Abilene and waited for the long time it takes for admission.

He was in the hospital a total of 80 days. During this time my friends and neighbors sat with him in shifts every night while I went home for some rest. If her had been in Abi-

lene it would have been less convenient for me and those who expressed concern and kindness by helping and keeping check on our needs.

During this long period of confinement, my husband received excellent service from the doctor, nurses and all the staff. Many of the nurses were personal friends of the family and went beyond the call of duty to care for him seeing to his every need and keeping him as comfortable as possible. My children appreciated their kindness

also. Each night when I left the hospital I knew he was in the hands of those who cared. I hope the people of the county will band together and keep our hospital in operation for the many who need it.


