## Community Development Meet Scheduled for Dec. 16

BAIRD—Are you interested in your Community? Do you want to see Baird Grow? What do you think we as citizens can do to make Baird a better Community? Bring in industry? Lift the face of our town? These are all questions to be answered at the Community Development Meeting, which has been scheduled for 7 p.m. in the Baird School Cafeteria on December 16. The speaker for the evening will be the West Texas Chamber of Commerce Chairman Harry M. Clark, one of the most experienced community developers in America.

Mr. Clark is a native of Mississippi and a graduate of Bowling Green (Kentucky) College of Commerce. He served four and half years in World War II with the last two years as a member of General Eisenhower's SHAEF staff. For his work in connection with the press coverage of D-Day he received the American Bronze Star and the British MBE decorations. He was the youngest (22) graduate in the history of the National Institute for Commercial and Trade Organization Executive (Northwestern University 1940).

He has been honored with several awards for his work in Community Development. Mr. Clark will speak to the citizens of Baird on several areas, but here are some of the specifics he will discuss with the group: COMMUNITY BETTERMENT: he will review the community's feelings on prospective industries, make observations of possible downtown improvements, and evaluate the business climate as a factor in further industrial growth. RESEARCH AND ANALYSIS: help the citizens compile data about community recommendations and suggestions and assistance in locating resource materials. ORGANIZATION IMPROVEMENT: help establish Community clinics

to evaluate the operating procedures, committee structure and general office management by-laws revision. So if you interested in the growth of Baird and really want to help get some of these community services started; or if you just interested in what Mr. Clark has to say, about our community; please try to attend this meeting. It promises to be very interesting and enlightening. There is no age limit, the Baird Chamber asks that everyone attend from the high school student to the Senior Citizen, after all Baird is everybody's town. So please attend this Community Development Meeting. After all, meetings like this help form the town you live in and they need your support!

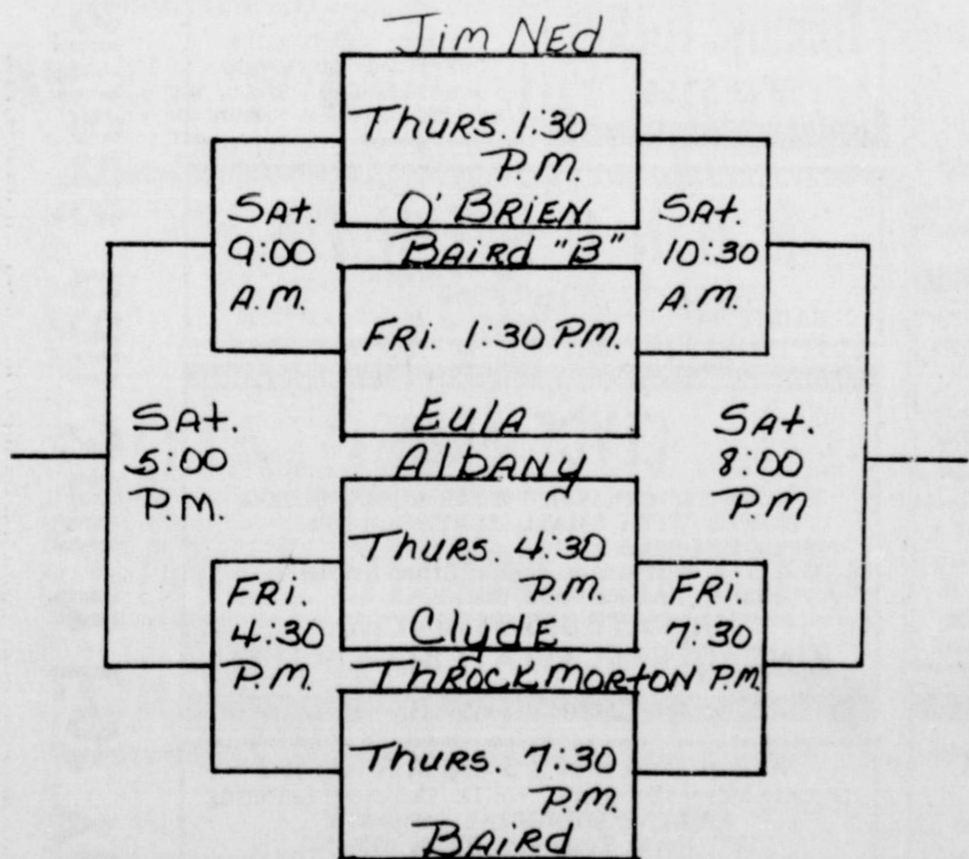

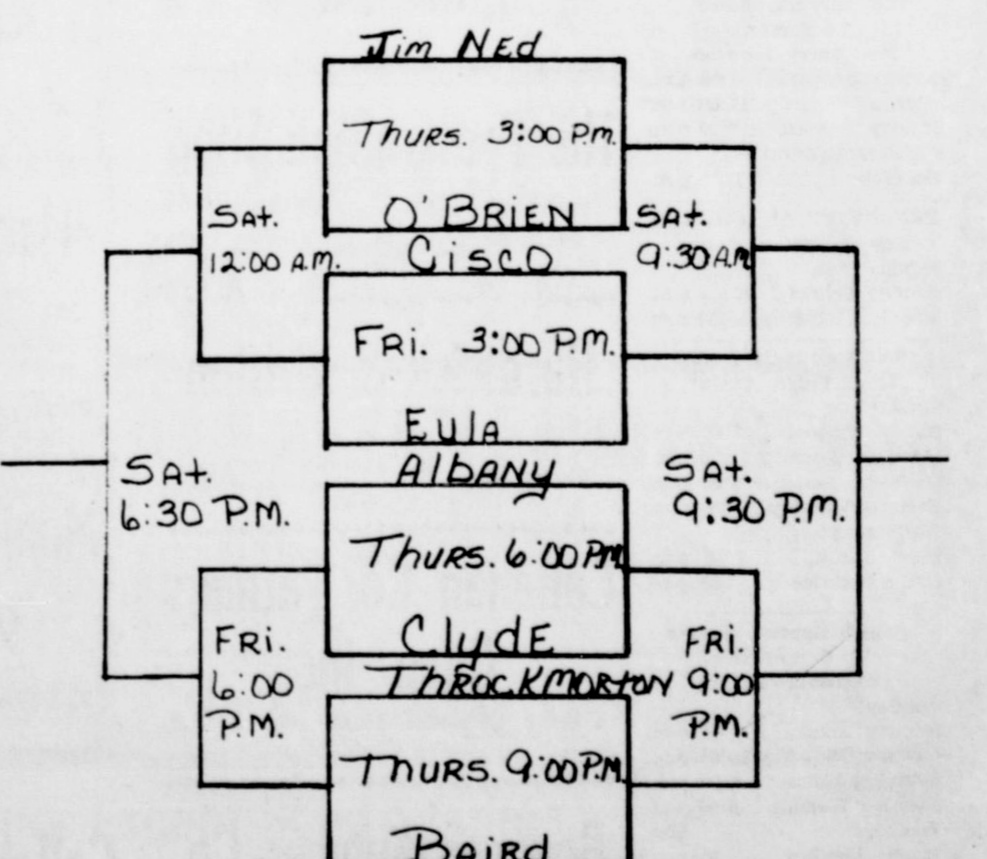

The home received this lovely letter from one of its residents and we want to share it with you.

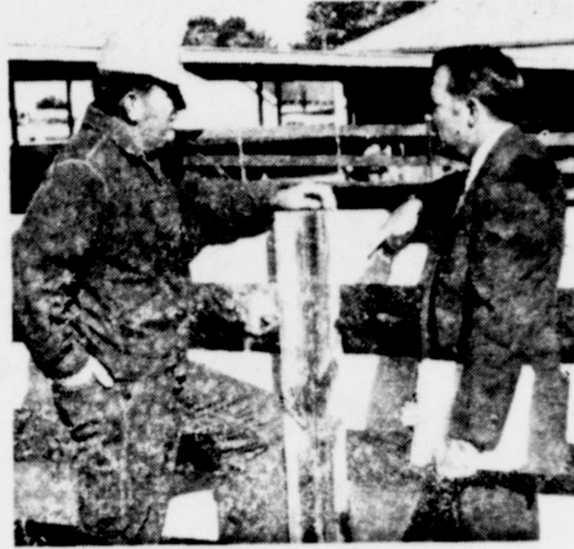

### THE FAMILY LAWYER

"Follow That Car!"

Suppose a policeman jumps into the back seat of your automobile and shouts:

"Follow that car!"  
Are you obliged to obey? Generally speaking, you are indeed. Under the ancient "hue and cry" doctrines of the common law, an officer may commandeer any vehicle that he needs to catch a fleeing felon.



As Judge Benjamin Cardozo once put it:

"The horse has yielded to the motorcar as an instrument of pursuit and flight. Still, as in the days of Edward I, the citizenry may be called upon to enforce justice, not faintly and with lagging steps but honestly and bravely and with whatever implements and facilities are at hand."

You may even be obliged to help in making the actual arrest (at least, say some states, if you are an "able-bodied male over 18 years of age"). To refuse, without good reason, could make you guilty of a misdemeanor.

On the other hand, in the event that you do lend a hand, the community owes you certain legal benefits in return.

For example: A man was called upon by the sheriff to help in arresting an armed fugitive. In the ensuing gunplay, he suffered a bullet wound in the shoulder.

He was therefore entitled, a court ruled afterward, to collect workmen's compensation—just like any county employee injured in the line of duty.

In another case, a clerk in a store helped a policeman make an arrest that turned out to be an error. In short order, the clerk found himself facing a damage suit for "false arrest."

But the court held him not liable. The court said making him pay damages for an innocent mistake, in no way his fault, would be shabby thanks from society to a good citizen.

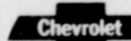
