#### THE REVIVAL.

The Methodist revival conducted by Rev. R. J. Birdwell which began on May 5th closed Sunday May. 21. Notwithstanding the frequent rains and other hindrances, the meeting was a success. About 60 conversions are reported, most of whom have joined or will join the different Churches represented in town.

Some boys were playing near the tabernacle late Saturday evening when a lighted match was either accidentally or designedly applied to the cotton bagging used for the covering and instantly the whole top was a blaze of fire and the entire covering consisting partly of cotton bagging and partly of cotton cloth was burned off except a very small portion which was torn off on the west side. The benches and plank seats were so badly smoked, that the tabernacle was abandoned and the remaining services held in the Methodist Church near by.

It was the best meeting so far as results accomplished goes that has been held in Baird for years. A number of young men joined the church as well as young ladies. It is not hard to get the women to join the church but of late years it seems difficult to reach the young men. Evangelist Birdwell seems to have succeeded in the respect where many others have failed.

A protracted meeting was begun by Rev. John T. Hinds at the Christian Church Sunday. See notice elsewhere.

#### DISTRICT COURT.

District Court adjourned for the term Monday night after two weeks and one day in session. One half the time was taken up by the murder trial of Joe Davis charged with poisoning his wife, transferred from Shackelford County. This case required all of last week and the case was given to the jury late Saturday night. Sunday morning a verdict was rendered finding the defendant guilty and assessing the penalty at imprisonment in the State penitentiary for life. Monday a motion for a new trial was made. After mature consideration Judge Calhoun granted a new trial and on his own motion transferred the case to Eastland where it will be heard in July.

It is rumored that the Jury stood eleven for inflicting the death penalty to one for life imprisonment. The case attracted more attention than any case tried here for years and while public sentiment was somewhat divided no surprise was manifested at the verdict.

The grand jury returned only 19 bills 5 felonies and 14 misdemeanors. Pretty good showing for a wet county of ten thousand population.

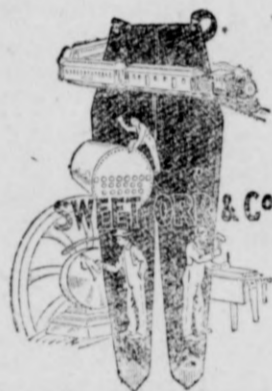
