Progress en Orient

More than twenty five miles of track have been laid on the est from Minaca, in the state of Chihuahua Mexico, and it is expected that the road with Groceries. be finished to Boycona, a distance of seventy-five miles, by Oct. 1. Orient work at Thomas

We inspected the Orient Grade at Thomas Sunday and found the work being pushed as rapidly as possible. They are short of men and could use a great many more at wages ranging for \$1.50 and \$1,75 to \$2.00 per day. There is less than two per day. There is less than two miles of grade between Thomas and the Canadian to be finished yet. The yards at Thomas will be finished in about a week. Mr. Adams, who is grading the yards, will then move to Deer Creek. He has the privilege of grading seven miles more south from Thomas, which shows that the Orient intends to build its own track from there to Clinton which will probably cause them to get here later in the season than they would if they used the Frisco track.-The Clinton Journal.

Foard County Crops

There has not been since the settlement of this county a better all round crop than now. It is a fact however that wheat and oats are somewhat short, the average is really short of what farmers expected, but a fair crop has been raised and much of it is now in the granaries, threshers are pushing for the ending of the threshing season. The corn crop, while not ful-ly matured, is advanced to the

stiff dough stage with a fair season in the ground, and all this writing is is raining and the outlook is that a good rain will follow in all parts of the county, thus our corn crop will be ahead of any former crop in the county.

The maize, Kaffir corn and sorghum are all we could ask, and a large acreage has been planted. These three last named crops alone would place us in much better shape than we have been for the past several years. But we are not done yet. The cotton crop, which is large in acreage, is also the most years. promising crop we have had for years. Of course the cotton might be cut short by late drouths or hot winds, but with the present season it is hardly probable that that the hot winds will do much damage, or that the drouth will materially injure the drouth will materially injure it, in fact some dry weather will be needed to check the growth of the stalk. This good crop has been on cheap land, and with improved agricultural implements. The cost of raising is less perhaps than in almost any locality in the state, and Foard County is in the swim.






