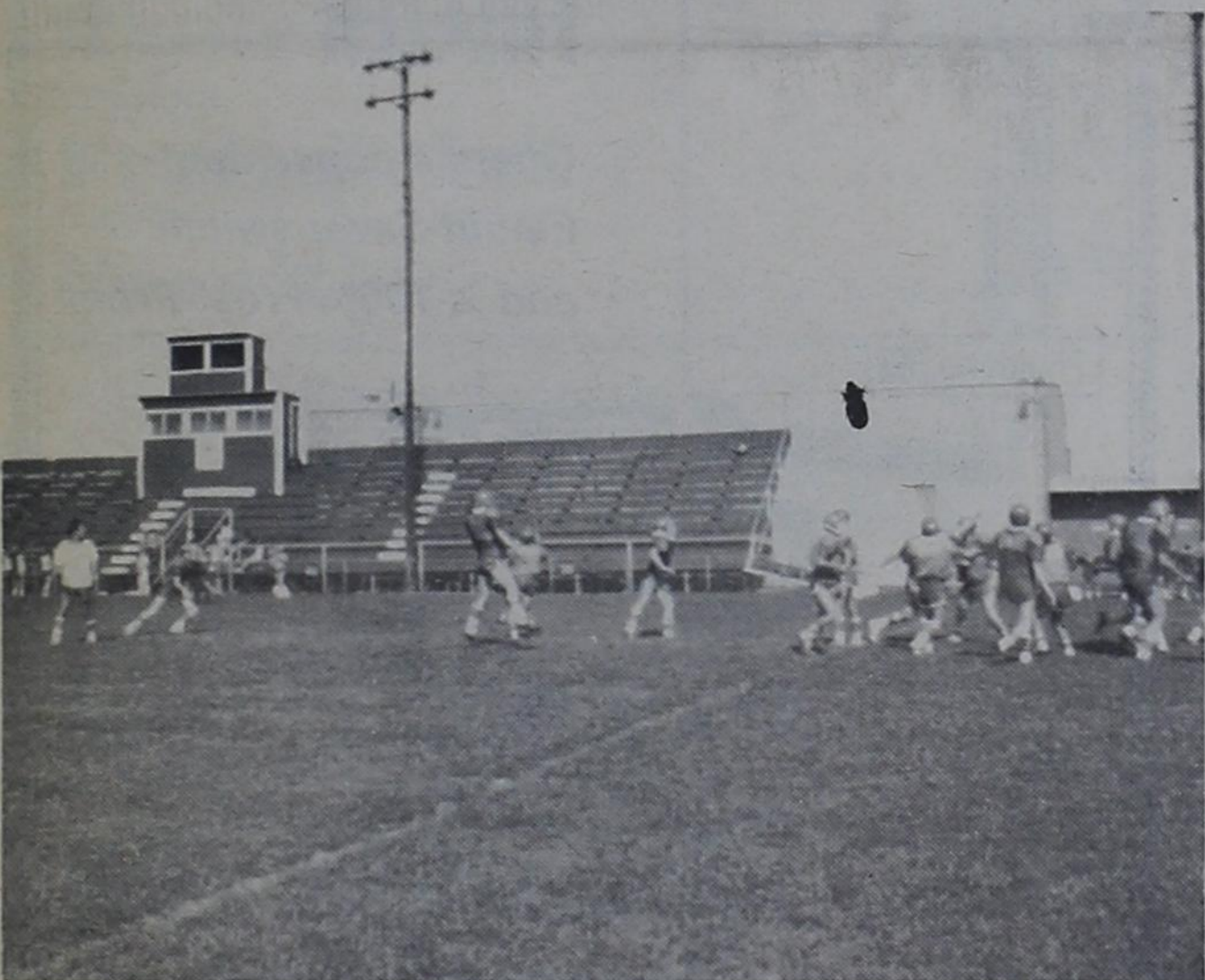

Four Countians Named To Cattlemen's Round-Up

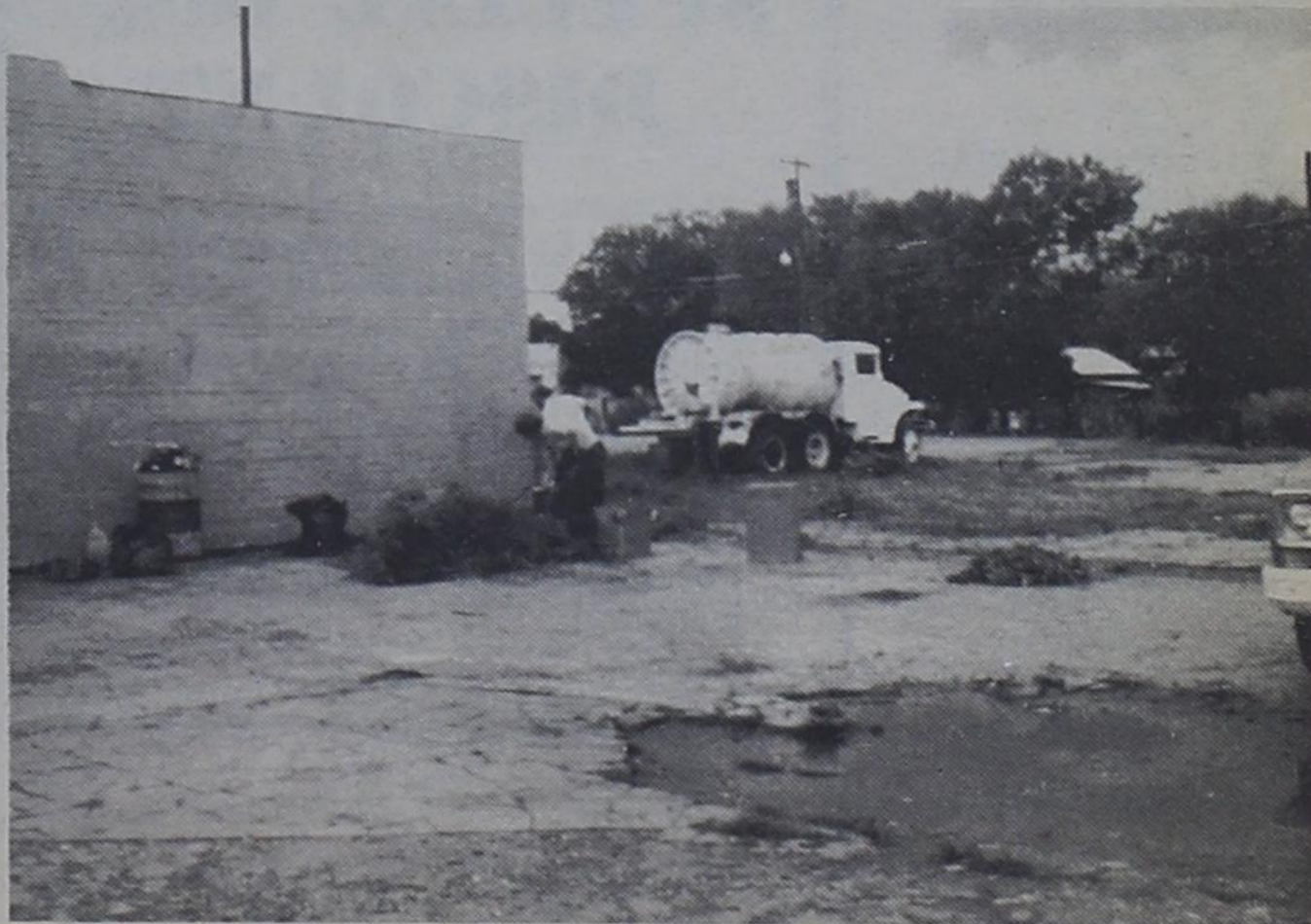

James Trammell Densman - Haas Nominated for Degree Married Friday

CLYDE—James Trammell, vocational agriculture instructor and FFA advisor at Clyde High School, has been nominated to receive the FFA's honorary American Farmer Degree.

Trammell was nominated for the degree by the Texas FFA Association and the nomination was approved by the National FFA Board of Directors which recently met in Alexandria, Virginia.

The honorary American Farmer Degree is the highest obtainable from the FFA.

Only 73 vo-ag teachers in the nation were nominated to receive the degree.

Trammell has been a vocational agriculture teacher at Clyde for 16 years. During that time, he has had three students to earn the American Farmer Degree.

Fifty students have received the Lone Star Farmer Degree under Trammell's leadership. Thirty-two of Trammell's students have received the Lone Star Farmer Degree.

The Lone Star Farmer Degree is the highest obtainable on a state level.

Trammell has also taught a state FFA president, a national public speaker winner and several state public speakers, and coached many state leadership and judging teams.

Trammell is one of a select group of 10 agriculture teachers in Texas to be nominated for the degree this year. He will attend the National FFA Convention in Kansas City, Mo., on Nov. 7-9 where he will be presented the degree pending final approval of the National FFA Organization.

The degree will be presented during a Thursday afternoon session of the Convention.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN BY CALLAHAN COUNTY OF ITS RENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Landlords and persons who live in rental property are urged to contact the Housing Authority of Callahan County concerning participation in a program designed to assist our citizens to secure decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

The program benefits landlords and owners by providing financial assistance during vacancy and certain depository and damage guarantees. The program aids eligible renters by providing financial assistance on the basis of need.

Persons that wish to apply for rent assistance must make application for eligibility and subsequently provide proof of income. Applicants must be a family or head of household. If an individual applies he or she must be 62 years of age or handicapped or disabled.

Cost of housing occupied by the applicant must be within the limits set forth in a fair market rent schedule. Fair Market rents are based on standard market housing, however any standard unit falling within the Fair Market schedule is eligible.

Participation in the rent assistance program is voluntary on the part of owners/landlords and renters.

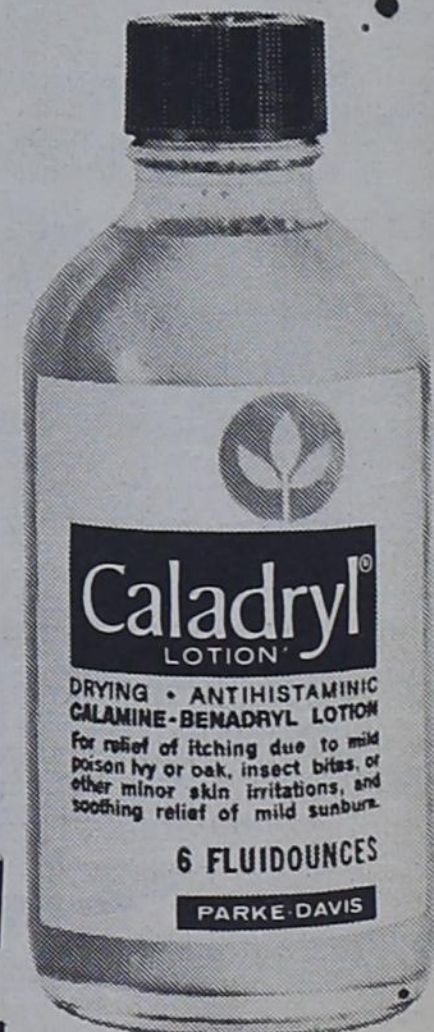

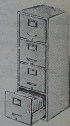

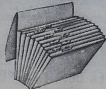
