The following is condensed from an address lately given by Dr. J. H. Kellogg. It is worthy of our profoundest attention. It is from a great man who has long practised what he preaches:

"The human race has lost the right way of living. There is a road that leads to death. There is a right road and there is a rong road. One cannot go in the right one and the wrong one at the same time. We have so utterly neglected natural ways, and sought out ways of our own, so far from nature, that we are suffering from maladies that are brought upon us wholly as a result of our wrong habits of life. The various animals have teeth and stomaches exactly adapted to what they were designed to eat. But notice the ordinary hotel bill of fare. There are herbs, such as asparagus, cabage, lettuce and other kinds of grass and green things which really require the four stomachs of a cow to digest them. Then there are the grains and fruits which are suitable for a human stomach. The meat requires the stomach of a carnivorous animal to digest it."


