Kathy Jones Holds National Record

BAIRD — Of the 144 track performances by school girls this year, Texas claimed 54, according to the National Federation of State High School Associations. No other state can claim even a dozen of the best performances, the national organization said.

Its finding were reported in the University Interscholastic Leagues' December newspaper.

Kathy Jones of Baird was one of three Texas girls to run the 100-yard dash in 10.9 seconds, and no other girls in the nation broke 11 seconds. Miss Jones also leaped 5 feet, 11 inches in the high jump, three inches higher than any other girl.

Karen Arp of Ropesville, near Lubbock and Marcia Talley of Garden City, near Big Spring, also ran the 100 in 10.9, and Miss Talley had the best time in the 220, 24.7 seconds.
