## Officials Locate Relatives Of Bartlett

Relatives of George Howard Bartlett were located this week by local law enforcement officials. One sister, Mrs. Leon Atchison of Fort Worth, his mother, also of Fort Worth, and two sisters in California.

Bartlett, 62, was found dead atop a mountain six miles south of Admiral Wefiesday morning, by an oil field pumper, Emmitt Price, on the C. M. Caldwell ranch.

At first authorities believed the man had died of a heart attack, but later during an autopsy by Dr. B. B. Trotter of Abilene, two bullet wounds were discovered. One entered the back and came out at mid-chest, the other entering the right groin and exited through the right buttock.

Law enforcement officials, with what seemed to be a murder case on their hand, backtracked to the death scene atop the mountain Friday morning. The search revealed a suitcase, apparently belonging to the dead man, some 100 yards from the spot where the body was found. It was apparent that someone had gone through the suitcase.

Reports from relatives are that Bartlett had resided in a hotel in Chicago for the past

few years, in the summer months, traveling to California for the winter. It is believed he was on his way to California when he met unexpected fate, somewhere in Callahan County, maybe the place where he was found dead Wednesday morning.

His sister, Mrs. Atchison had not been in contact with him for the past few years.

Graveside rites were held Saturday at 10 a.m. before any relatives had been located. Burial was in Ross Cemetery under direction of Godfrey Funeral Home.

Bartlett was identified immediately from his wallet which contained a birth certificate, driver's license, \$15.00, and bus ticket stubs. An additional \$635 was discovered in the man's socks at Godfrey Funeral Home, where the body was taken.

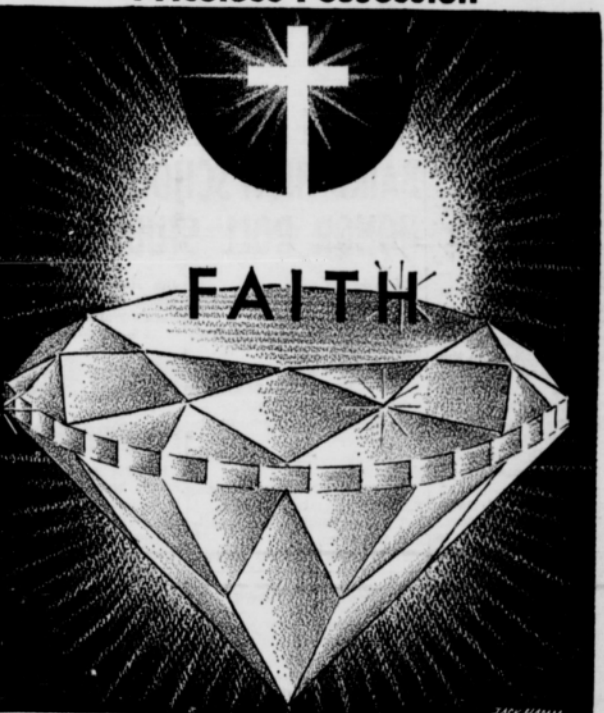

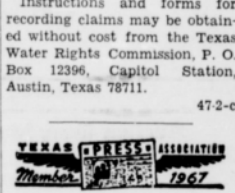

However, in any case where any claimant of a riparian right has prior to August 28, 1967, commenced or completed the construction of works designed to apply a greater quantity of water to beneficial use, such rights shall be recognized to the extent of the maximum amount of water actually applied to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1970, inclusive; provided an additional sworn statement is filed on or before July 1, 1971. Failure to file the sworn statement or statements in substantial compliance with Section 4 shall extinguish and bar any claim of water right to which the Section applies.
