WE EXTEND OUR congratulations to the four members of the Baird High School football team who were selected last week to the all-area Class A squad by the Abilene Reporter-News.

And we give an especially deep bow to Guard Bruce Bell, who was named the area's outstanding Class A lineman, and to Coach Vernon Townsend, selected as area Class A coach of the year by the Abilene newspaper.

Baird was one of only two teams in this entire area to capture two slots on the first team -- Bell at guard and Richard Windham at fullback. Both you will recall, were also all-district choices by coaches.

And we also captured two honorable mentions in end Kelton Jones and tackle Maxie Gordon.

Oddly enough, the only other team to be mentioned twice on first-team all-area selections was Merkel -- a pre-season choice to be the best in the area but a disappointment in the win column all year.

The eleventh Callahan County Junior Livestock Show will be held at the show barn in Cross Plains Jan. 15 and 16. The show has been increased to two days because of the large number of entries this year.

Dairy cattle, breeding swine, market barrows, breeding sheep, breeding goats, poultry and rabbits will be judged on Friday, Jan. 15.

Saturday's judging will include breeding beef classes, market lambs, dry lot steers, milk fed steers and horses. Horse classes have been added for the first time this year.

Eula Future Farmers will hold a Christmas turkey shoot at the Vocational Agriculture building on the Eula school grounds Sunday, Dec. 20, from 2 to 5 p. m. There will also be a candy shoot in addition to the turkeys.

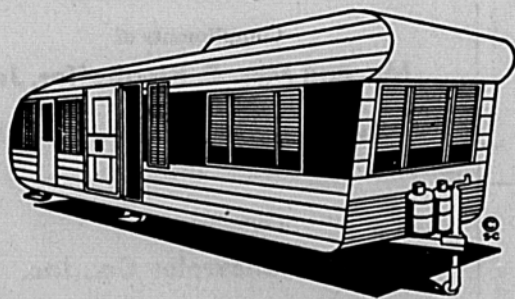

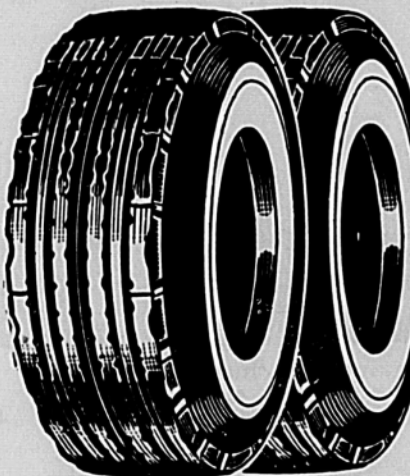

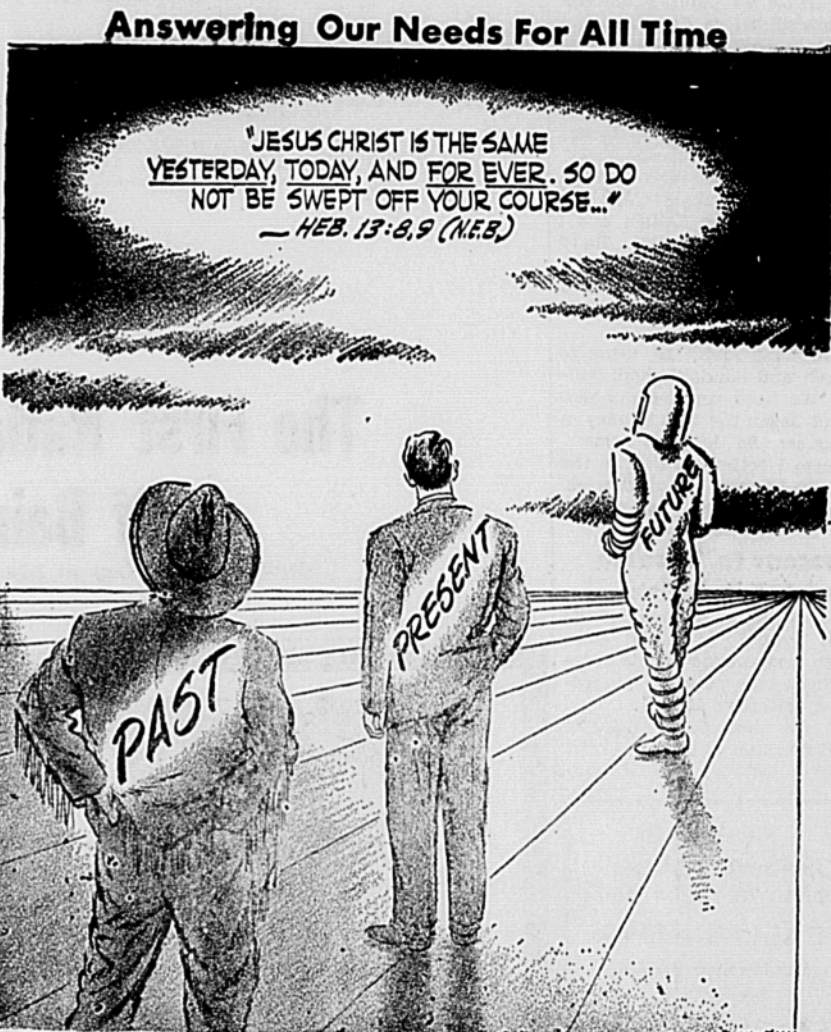

Mrs. Blackburn was also a leader in establishment of the museum several years later.

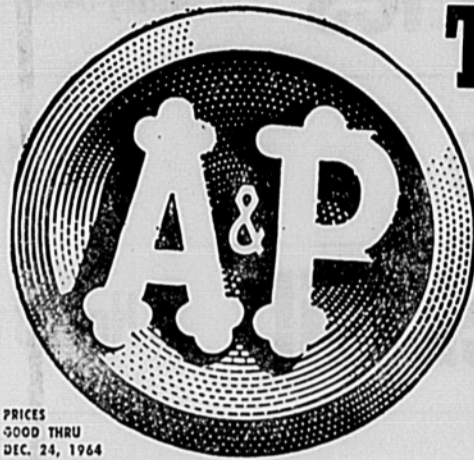
Both the library and museum are maintained in the county
