## Runoff Due for Commissioner Pre-1; Miller Re-elected as Sheriff

BAIRD — Grayson Miller won a second term Saturday in the race for Sheriff of this County. He received 1,912 votes to Billy McMillan's 758. These were the only candidates seeking this office. Miller has just completed his first term, and is a native of the Eula community.

Incumbent Irvin Corn of Baird will face a runoff with Tommy Tucker of Clyde for Commissioner of Precinct 1. Corn received 665 votes and Tucker 528. Others in this race were Cecil Mings of Clyde with 453, and Ralph E. McAdams, of North Callahan County, 120.

The governor's race produced a few surprises as Sissy Farenthold, the lady candidate from Corpus Christi, plowed under five men candidates to place her in a runoff against Dolph Briscoe, Uvalde rancher and banker. Many Texas natives and newcomers probably figured Ben Barnes would surely be in the runoff, however the record shows that Texans are tired of listening to political hanky-panky, and if you are elected to a post, you had better tend your business properly because voters may not give you another chance. The way

voters have sought to stand up and be heard has placed new faith in citizens who are tired of poor government and want something done. Citizens will now see that a man or woman placed in office will do what he or she is sent there to do. We will stand up and be counted and say, "It's Great To Be A Texan."

Callahan County tabulation showed Dolph Briscoe leading the ticket for governor with 1,688. Farenthold 449; Barnes 124, Preston Smith 310. Willis 9, Posey 7 and Looney 2.

In the Lieutenant Governor's race, Hobby received 1,257, Conrally 645, Christi 293, Hall 295, Jones 96, McCord 28 and Stand-lee and Skates received 12 each.

Attorney General, John Hill piled up 1,492 votes to Crawford Martin's 1,006. Pate received 88.

For State Comptroller: Calvert received 1,181; Wilson, 321; Pendleton 280; Blankenship 197; Stanford Smith 153 and Roberson 96.

State Treasurer: James 1,410; Rudolph 545; Weldon 149; Robnett 271; Smylie 72 and Cruz 31.

For Agriculture Commissioner: White 1,724 and Bell 690.

Railroad Commissioner: Tunnell 1,340; West 564 and Lawson 430.

Referendum vote: For 1,870 and Against 552.

A total of 2,767 of the 4,426 registered voters turned out to cast their ballots Saturday. Clyde registered 1,621 with 950 going to the polls; Baird 1,029 registered, 633 voted; Cross Plains registered 969 with 609 voting; Putnam registered 225 and had 129 voters; Eula recorded 164 votes from 272 registered voters; Oplin 91 out of 134 registered and Denton Valley voted 108 from 176 registering. A recorded 67 voted absentee throughout the 7 precincts in the County.

A larger turnout is expected in the 2nd Primary, as voters cast their votes in the runoff elections June 3rd. The only County race will be for the Precinct 1 Commissioner's post between Irvin Corn and Tommy Tucker. Be ready to cast your ballot on June 3rd.

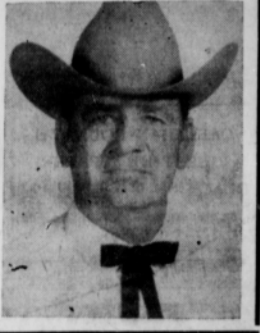

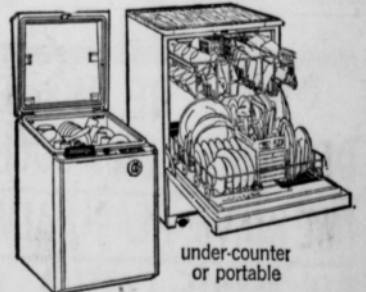

## Spray Pecan Trees May 14-17 To Control Pecan Nut Casebearer

Judging from pecan nut casebearer moth emergence and observation indications that the best time to spray control of the pecan nut casebearer in Callahan County will be during the period of May 14 to 17.

To determine the best time for applications of controls for the pecan nut casebearer on a particular tree, observation of the ends of the nutlets for eggs of the pecan nut casebearer is most reliable. Generally spray applications should be applied 4 to 5 days after eggs are first found. The newly laid eggs appear light green in color. As they mature the eggs take on a reddish cast and after eggs begin to exhibit this red appearance, control measures should be applied the following day. Another good indication that it is time to spray for the pecan nut casebearer is to inspect the nutlets on the pecan tree daily and apply the control application immediately after the first nutlet entry by the casebearer larvae is observed. One of these two methods should be employed by larger pecan producers in their orchards.

The insecticides that can be used for control of pecan nut casebearer are Guthion, Thiodan, malathion and toxaphene. Use these insecticides according to directions given on the label. Thorough coverage is essential for control of the casebearer. Be sure that the sprays

are applied to the tree to the point of running off.

For most effective control a second application of insecticides may be needed. This can be determined by observing the nutlets for newly laid eggs several days after the first application. When observed a second application of insecticides should be applied 7 to 10 days following the first application. For further information on control of pecan nut casebearer, contact your county agricultural agent.
