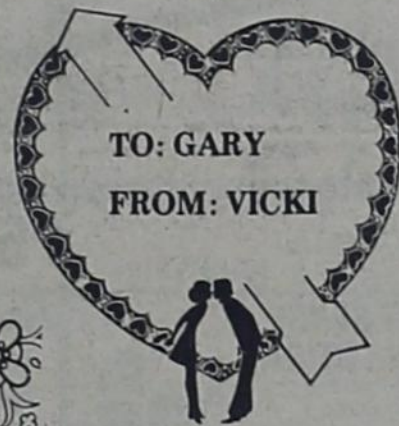
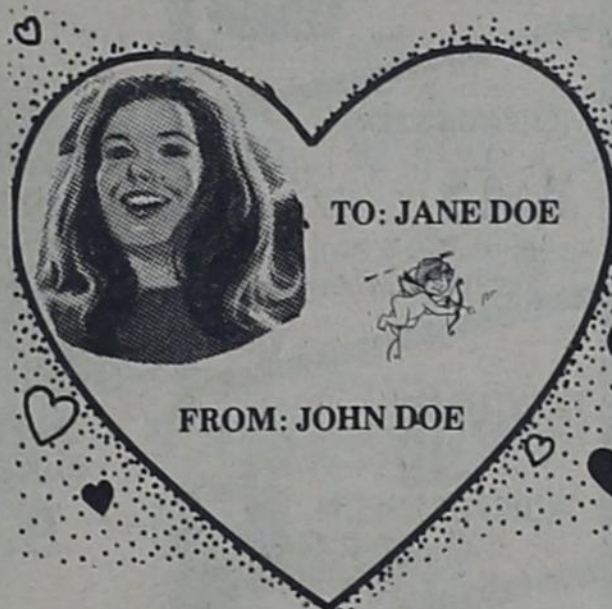


Celebrate Valentine's Day In A Special Way This Year

Burglary Of Eula School Reported

The Callahan County Sheriff's office reported this week that the Eula School had been burglarized over the weekend. The burglary occurred sometime Friday night or Saturday.

Entrance to the building was gained by prying open the front door. The burglars then entered the principal's office by going through the ceiling.

Taken in the burglary was an electric stopwatch and a Panasonic Programmable tuner-timer. Value of the items is unknown at this time.

According to Sheriff's Deputy Jess Henley, the burglary is identical to the one which occurred at the school Nov-

ember 11, 1981. For this reason, it is believed the same person or persons is responsible. There are no suspects at this time, however, the investigation is continuing.

The Sheriff's office also reported the arrests of two Callahan County men for the theft of oil field equipment valued at \$1099.13. The equipment had been stolen from R.E. Green on January 19 of this year.

Charged in the thefts were Chet Webb, 23 and Ricky Beasley, 23 both of Callahan County.

Both men have each been released on a \$5,000.00 bond.

Filing deadline for running in the May 1 election was a 6 p.m. Monday. Only one other person filed on that day.

Funded by federal, county and local governments, the project is geared to serve free meals to county residents aged 60 and over. Program developeris Brenda Elkins with the Regional Planning Commission of the West Central Texas Council of Governments.

The meals will be prepared in the central kitchen at Clyde, then distributed to the nutrition sites. The meals will be served in Clyde five days a week in the Senior Citizens Building, in Baird on Tuesday only at the MEals on Wheels Building and five days a week in Putnam. Although there is no charge for these meals, all donations are gladly accept-

ed.

Wednesday Club Receives Award For Hydrant Spotters

The Wednesday Club of Baird, which sponsored the project of placing sample fire hydrant spotters in Abilene a few months ago, has received an award and a letter

of commendation from the Edward C. Michener Associates Inc., of Harrisburg, Pa.

The fire hydrant spotter project was initiated under the Safety Division of the

It is hoped that many other clubs will follow the example of the Baird Wednesday Club in sponsoring the use of the fire hydrant spotters.

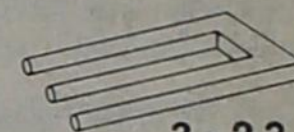

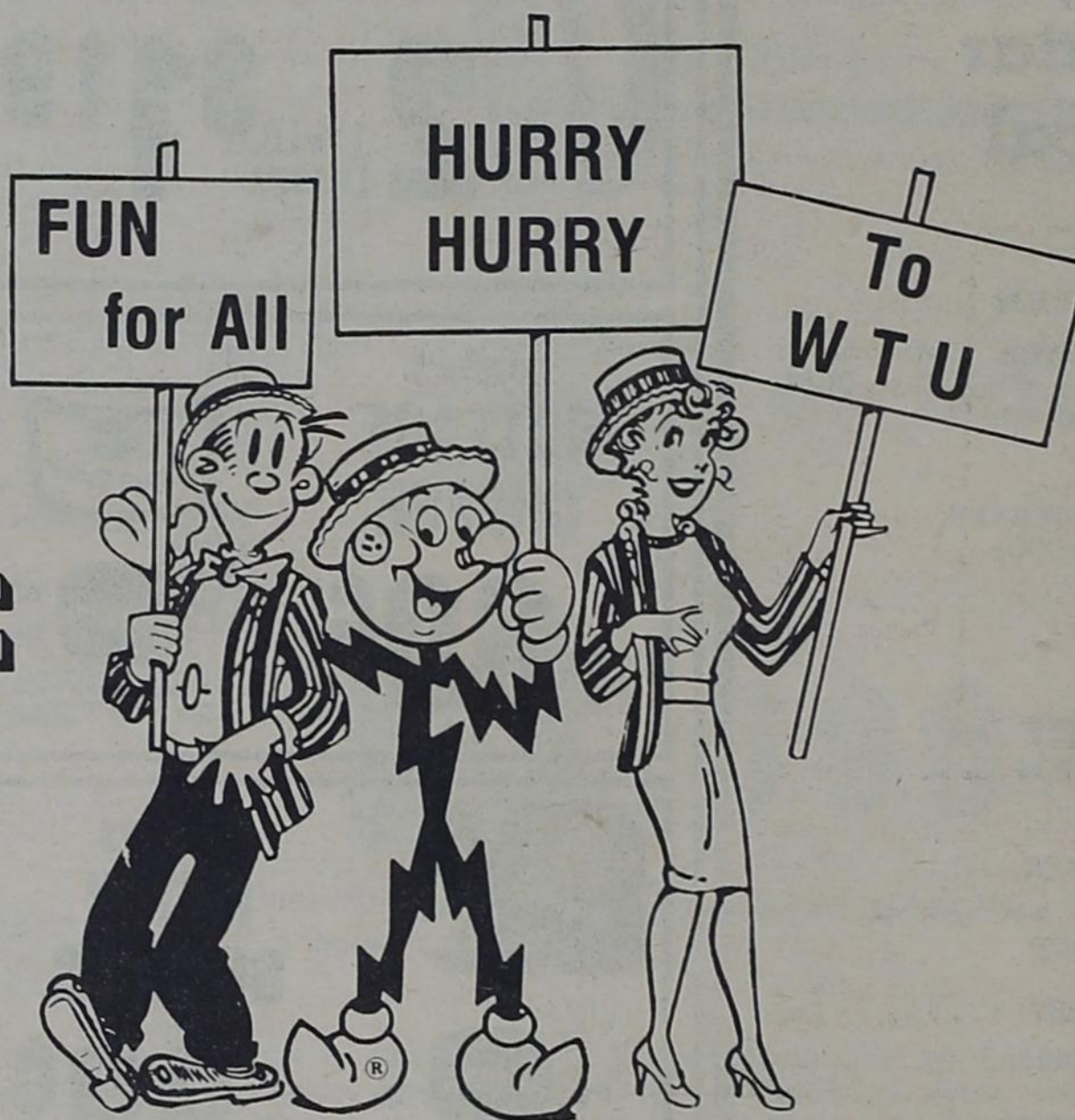
