## O'Donnell Still Leading in Number of Bales

Cotton receipts at the local yard reached 10,400 Thursday night and a steady stream of wagons and trucks are bringing in the fleecy staple all day Thursday, although it was a holiday and many farmers thought the gins would not run.

In some parts of the O'Donnell territory the farmers are through picking and some are pulling bolls, but there are several thousand bales yet to come in. O'Donnell is easily leading all towns on the Southplains as to the number ginned and the prospects are good that it will keep up the lead all through the season.

Last year on this date the yard receipts totaled 8,572.
