Mrs. Casey Ill From Paralytic Stroke

Mrs. J. C. Casey is seriously ill this week at her home in the north part of town, having sustained a paralytic stroke Saturday evening. She was found lying partly inside the door when a group of young ladies called for her daughter, Drucilla. As this is being written, she has not regained consciousness, and attending physicians describe her condition as grave.

Children have been called to her bedside, several of them arriving during Sunday. Mr. Casey died some eighteen months ago.

Mrs. Gross had been in poor health for several months, her illness beginning with an attack of flu. Dropsy followed that illness, and the invalid had been in a New Mexico hospital for some weeks for treatment. Brought home last week she appeared to be recovering, able to be in town on Saturday before her death.

A seizure in the nature of a paralytic stroke was immediate cause of her demise. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Riggs, pioneer residents of the

South Plains and Dawson County, Mrs. Gross had spent all her lifetime in and near O'Donnell. As a student in the O.K. school, she was much loved by teachers and fellow students. Since her marriage to Mr. Gross five years ago, they had made their home here and in Tahoka much of the time, so that she had many friends here.

Mrs. Gross is survived by her

After a short wedding trip, Mr. and Mrs. Baskin are at home in Lamesa, where he is part owner of a drug store.

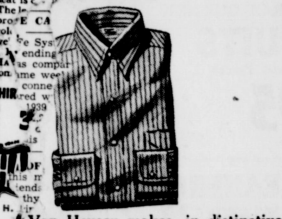
