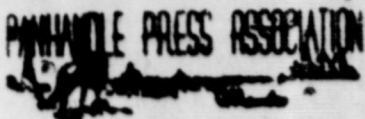

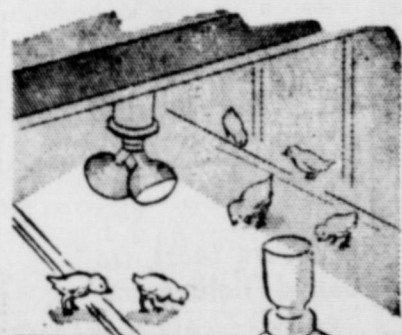


Proper Farm Belt Care Gives Longer Service

Proper care of the flat belts that drive threshers, ensilage cutters, buzz-saws and other farm machinery will result in years more service and prevent breakdowns and costly repairs. Here are a few suggestions for prolonging the life of farm belts:

1. Protect belts from oil by splash guard.
2. Use vulcanized splices to repair belts. Metal fasteners tear the fabric, expose belt ends to moisture.
3. Remove oil or grease accumulations with dry-cleaning fluid.
4. Store belts in a dark, cool and dry place when not using them.
5. Maintain correct alignment and keep pulleys clean.
6. Keep belt tension properly adjusted at all times.
7. Specify the manufacturer's machinery part number when ordering replacement belts.

The rapid progress in soil conservation for the last 20 years is the keynote of the annual report of the Soil Conservation Service for the 1951 fiscal year. The report also emphasized the need for soil conservation to aid the current mobilization effort and stresses the fact that total conservation is essential. Tremendous progress has been made in the science and practical application of soil and water conservation during the last two decades. The service helped 128,502 farmers and ranchers develop conservation plans on 36,259,299 acres last year. This brought the total as of June 30, 1951, to 853,348 plans covering 246,740,008 acres of land. There are now about 2,400 organized soil conservation districts operated by farmers and ranchers under state laws. The survey spent a total of some 64 million dollars for the fiscal year. Of this amount, about 52 million was for regular operations in soil conservation districts. About seven million was used for flood control work. About one and a half million was for research.

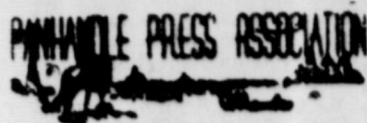

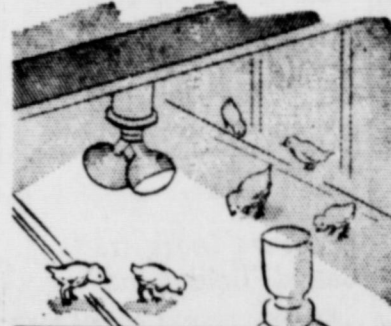
