Builds Own Home; Beats Housing Shortage

BERLIN, N.H.—One way to beat the housing shortage—if you have the time and talent, backbone and brawn—is to go out in the woods and start building your own house with your own hands.
 That's what Bob Hughes, Berlin artist and high school art instructor, decided to do about two years ago, and if all goes well, he hopes to move in with his wife and two children before long.
 The 36-year-old jack-of-all-trades has been building the new house almost single-handed during summers, weekends, and any spare time he can find.
 The front door will have 15 panels of thick pine, recessed and carved by the gifted young artist-teacher-marionette maker into the 12 signs of the zodiac, with three panels for another design. The front hall will be paneled in pine, some a foot and a half wide. The stairs are huge solid oak blocks.
 Bob Hughes is his own architect, designing the house himself and working from his own set of blue-prints. It is a combination of modern and traditional. The living room has a large picture window, composed of twelve panes which saves the expense of a single sheet of plate glass, and has the advantage of individuality.
 The kitchen will be done in white ash, and has a laundry shoot down into the basement.
 Looking tanned and rugged with a crew cut, dungarees and G.I. shoes, Bob didn't think he was doing anything particularly remarkable in building his own house. Although he was aboard the first landing craft to hit the coast of Normandie on D-Day, he knows he is not the first amateur to build a home for his family in this area. And he pointed out that he didn't dig the cellar-hole and has no intention of installing the furnace and plumbing.

Presence of Molecules Explains Expansion

SCHENECTADY, N.Y. — Why does heat make things expand?

Matter is made of molecules which are in constant motion, and the higher the temperature, the faster they move. If you have a volume of gas in a rubber balloon, the pressure of these molecules against the rubber is balanced by its pull. Warming the gas makes the molecules move faster, so they push harder against the rubber. It yields a little, and the gas expands.

With cooling, their motion is slowed, they exert less pressure, and the volume of gas gets smaller. Something similar occurs in a liquid, and also in a solid, although the molecules are held more tightly together. The amount which a solid expands for the same rise in temperature is considerably less than with a gas or liquid.

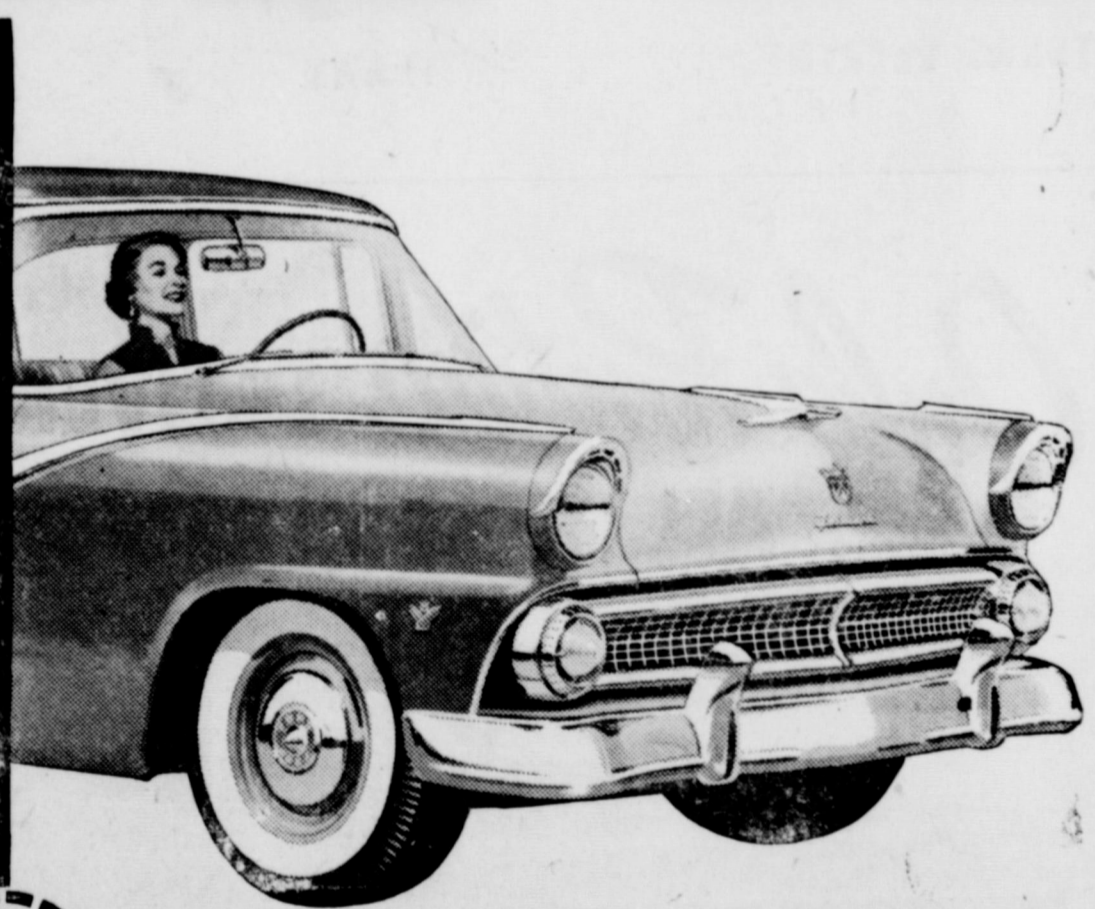

Birth Records Important

Most people are partial to months of late summer and fall. But not State Health Department birth record keepers. To the staff of the department's Bureau of Vital Statistics, August through October is the roughest time of the year. The reason: parents who know their children must have birth certificates before they enter school for the first time but who put off making requests for certified copies until the last minute. Last year bureau personnel processed more than 40,000 requests during those three months. For a limited staff, that means hours of night and week end work without overtime pay.

Bureau personnel shudder when they think of the estimated 227,000 kids who will be eligible to enter the first grade in September. Many of them have copies of birth records already and will create no problem. Others live in areas where local school boards do not require proof of age before admitting the child to the hallowed halls of learning.

But the majority don't have certified proof of age, despite the fact that they live in areas where school officials insist on such proof. It's this category that gives bureau statisticians and clerks sleepless nights.

Says Bureau Director W. D. Carroll: "We're ready to give immediate service to applications which come in before the fall rush."

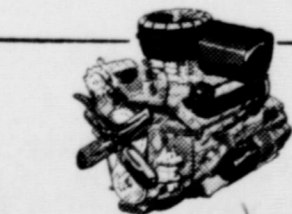
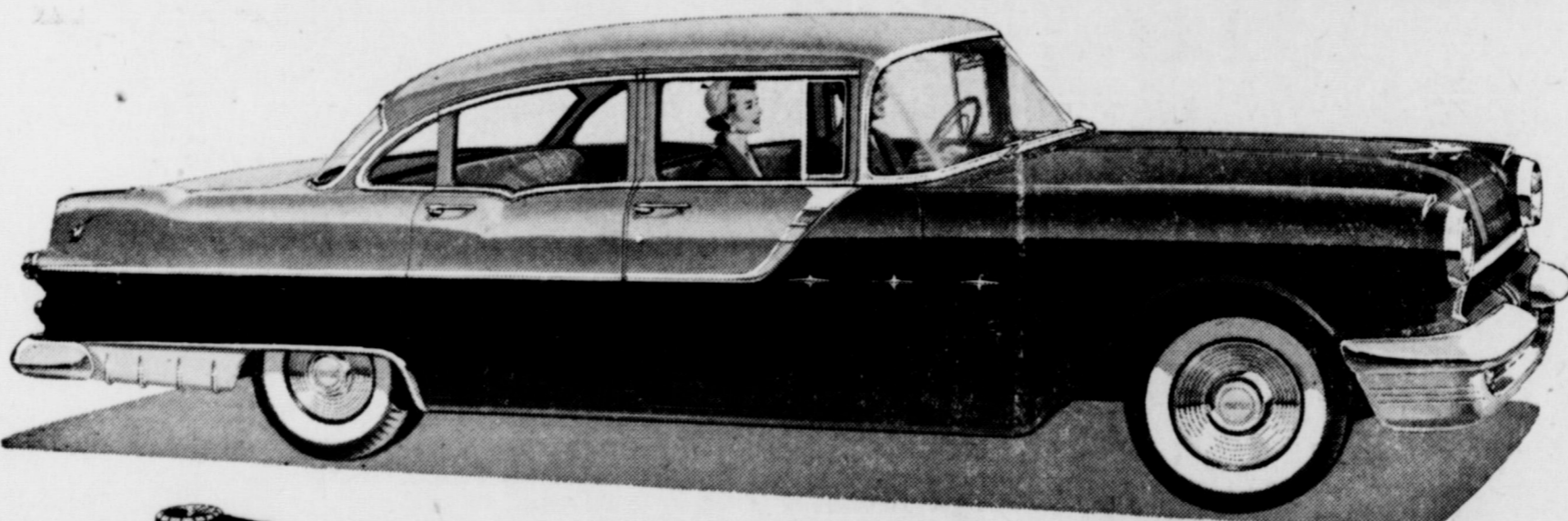

Sulphur a Favorite With These Orphans

MIDWAY, Ky.—Students of the Kentucky Female Orphan School in this little town like sulphur—and with good reason.

The school, believed to be the oldest of its kind in the U. S., is a "silent partner" in a new sulphur development of Freeport Sulphur Company at Nash dome in Fort Bend county, Texas.

Here's how it came about: Back in 1945 Mrs. Belle Wisdom, a native of Paducah, Ky., bequeathed the school 15,000 acres of Texas and which included Nash dome. The discovery of sulphur there came later, and Freeport leased the sulphur rights from the estate's trustee.

For every ton of sulphur that is mined the Kentucky school will receive a royalty. Freeport is developing Nash dome as part of an over-all program to increase the nation's supply of the mineral that is needed to make fertilizers, chemicals, petroleum products, steel, rubber, explosives and hundreds of other items.

Mrs. Wisdom, who died in Houston, Tex., in 1945, was one of the school's principal benefactors. During her lifetime, she gave \$50,000 to the school which now has 225 students from 21 states and two foreign countries and a 55-acre campus. A high school and a junior college prepares the girls either for business careers or for senior college.

Glaucoma Is Hazard To People Over 40

NEW YORK—Glaucoma is a word which carries very little meaning to most people, "yet that word will one day sound bitter overtones to one out of every 50 Americans over 40 years of age. These men and women—800,000 of them—are slowly losing sight from the eye disease glaucoma because of ignorance and neglect. Unfortunately, most of them do not realize that they face blindness."

To tell people over 40 the facts about glaucoma, the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness has published a pamphlet on the eye disease. Copies are available without charge.

The pamphlet points out that the best defense against glaucoma is a thorough eye examination at least once every two years after you reach 40.

It emphasizes that the three main points to remember about glaucoma are:

Strikes after 40 in most cases. Is difficult to detect in the early stages; as a result, many have the disease and don't know it.

Come to California And Try Burro Meat

LOS ANGELES, Calif.—Something different in the way of big game hunting is claimed by California, according to a recent news release from that state's department of fish and game.

Stray burros, left or lost by grizzled prospectors since the middle of the last century, have developed a unique race of wily, speedy beasts, and several thousand of these dust-cake jackasses now lord it over the barren desert hills.

These descendants of the 'bers will sometimes dress out to 500 pounds of sweet, gamey meat. (That's what the release said!) Consumption of burro meat is limited to humans by California law. The flesh is said to rank with that of the better game animals.

The burros take over and ruin precious desert springs, destroy forage for game and stock, and sometimes kill the young of other species.

Jako, the Parrot, Identifies Self

BERLIN—Jako, a 40-year-old parrot that disappeared when his master was arrested by the Russians in 1945, has returned to the restaurant of the Kaiser Wilhelm tower.

Jako picked up phrases that it should not have listened to. Among those were the regular greetings that Rita, the master's dog, received. Jako would sometimes add to its morning greetings, "Pful, Rita, aren't you ashamed of yourself?"

Max Mueller was released by the Russians in 1946 and reopened his restaurant. He missed Jako and decided to get another parrot, but did not like the birds that were offered.

Recently an American woman advertised a parrot that spoke 90 words. Mrs. Mueller went to look at the bird. It was in a bad mood and refused to speak. Mrs. Mueller did not recognize the parrot as Jako. She said, "No, I think I don't want him." Suddenly the parrot turned around and shouted at her, "Pful, Rita, aren't you ashamed of yourself?"

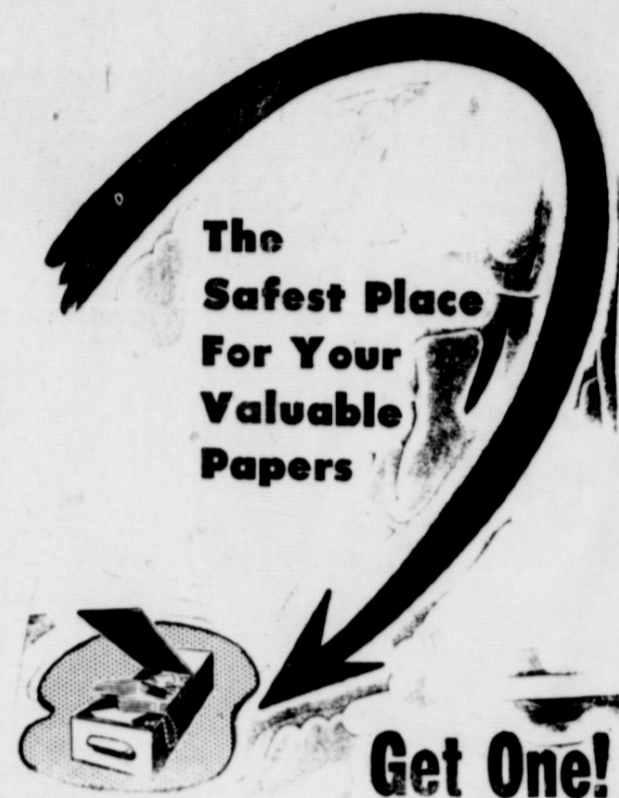
