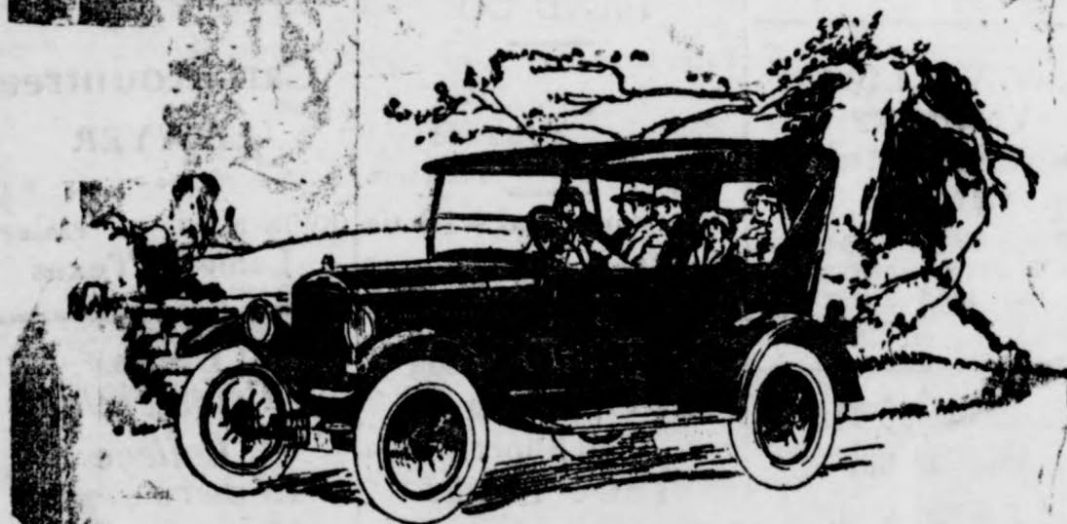

These are the figures on Monday, September 14. Students are enrolling every day, so next week they will not be large enough. Perhaps the most crowded condition exists in the high school. With only three teachers besides myself to teach the whole high school we already have our hands full. But the large number enrolling in the eighth grade is going to force us to either divide that grade or run the risk of losing classification. The State Department of Education requires that for a school to be classified it must have not more than thirty and preferably twenty pupils per class. There are enough irregular students in the Sophomore class to keep within the maximum limit in those classes, but it is impossible to do so with the Freshmen. Miss Cathey is crowded also, for

her pupils are large, and large pupils fill a room faster than small ones. Then too, she has too many classes. The first grade teachers are also crowded, due to the large number of unders.

Last year we divided the school into high and low divisions in order to enable teachers to make mid term promotions and to enable pupils who could not attend the entire term to make at least a half term's work instead of losing the whole year's work, as was frequently the case heretofore.

The people of O'Donnell might as well get ready to see six hundred pupils in daily attendance, for the enrollment is more than a hundred larger than it was this time last year. I do not know where we will put them, but we must stack them up somewhere.

The board has employed A. E. Cook, who takes the place of Mr. Burroughs, who recently resigned. Mr. Cook is a graduate of Abilene High School and of Simmonds University, being one of the honor students there. He

will teach Spanish and Science Beginning with next week each of the various classes and grades will make reports.

So far the school interest seems to be fine and, considering the crowded condition, we have made an excellent start.
