This week he pur chased two sections of the Wind ham estate in Terry county from the West Texas Real Estate Company for a lconsideration of Mr. Ward, representing the Rix \$35,000, or \$30 an acre. He plans t start work at once on the land and will put 1200 acres in cotton next spring. With the 600 acres he has in a farm near O'Donnell, this will give him 1800 acres which he will plant to cotton next spring.
