First National Bank of O'Donnell Opens Doors

The doors of the First National Bank were thrown open to the public for business last Saturday and Cashier L. Dennis reports that the number of accounts opened were very satisfactory.

The fixtures of the new bank are of walnut bronze and Georgia marble and present a very pleasing effect, and it is doubtful if there is a bank in any of the town on the Southplains that have such expensive fixtures. Two offices, one for the cashier and one for the president are in the front, back of which are the accounting rooms and the vault.

At present the office force consists of Mr. Dennis as cashier, C. E. Kelley assistant cashier and Mr. Kelley accountant.

With The First National Bank and The First State Bank O'Donnell is now equipped with financial institutions to take care of the growing needs of the town.

Hamilton to Plant 1800 Acres to Cotton Next Year

It has been the dream of M. C. Hamilton to be one of the largest cotton farmers on the Southplains and that dream is likely to reach a culmination within a few years. This week he purchased two sections of the Windham estate in Terry county from the West Texas Real Estate Company for a consideration of \$35,000, or \$30 an acre. He plans to start work at once on the land and will put 1200 acres in cotton next spring. With the 600 acres he has in a farm near O'Donnell, this will give him 1800 acres which he will plant to cotton next spring.

Mr. Hamilton will have his own seed and some to sell from his farm here, as he estimates that he will gather 200 bales this season.

Last year Mr. Hamilton sold \$21,872 worth of lint from his farm and the seed brought a great additional sum as they were in demand on account of the fine grade of cotton he grows.

Freeze Does Little Damage to Cotton

A little above 4,300 bales of cotton have been ginned to date. The cold weather of the past few days has retarded picking to some extent. While the thermometer dropped below the freezing point Wednesday night, the cotton was so far advanced that very little, if any, damage was done to the unopened bolls, farther than it will tend to lower the grade. Many pickers are arriving and next week will see a large increase over the ginning receipts of this week.

Since the government report was given out, cotton has dropped to around 19 cents, some in inferior grades bringing less.

Delicious refreshments of hot chocolate, sandwiches and cake were served. The total amount received for the evening was \$18.00. Every one seemed to enjoy this affair and it was for a needy movement which every one wants to help.

It has been suggested that their be an affair for the cemetery every three or four weeks.

O'Donnell Awarded Chevrolet Agency

A deal was made this week whereby an exclusive agency for the Chevrolet products was established in O'Donnell.

Heretofore the Chevrolet cars have been sold under the Post agency, by the Briley Grain Company of Tahoka, this place only receiving a very limited number of cars and only a small stock of accessories was carried. The name of the new company will be the Liles Chevrolet Company and will be under the direct management of J. D. Liles, who will soon move his family here and build a home.

Mr. Liles states that his company will soon begin the construction of a 50x100 foot brick building, incorporating all the appurtenances belonging to a fully equipped garage and accessory shop, handling the Chevrolet products exclusively. The initial outlay of money to be spent on the building and plant will be around \$10,000.

The large number of cars that have been sold in the O'Donnell territory during the past few months caused the agency for this zone at Oklahoma City to take notice that the town had reached such proportions as to demand an exclusive agency and service garage. Temporarily the home of the Liles Chevrolet Company is located in the Odd Fellow's building where H. G. Gantt has charge of the sales department.

The opening of this exclusive agency will prove of great convenience to many users of this make of cars and a general welcome is extended by the business men of the town.

Neighbors hearing their screams rushed to their assistance and broke in the window and rescued the girl, the boy being taken out the door.
