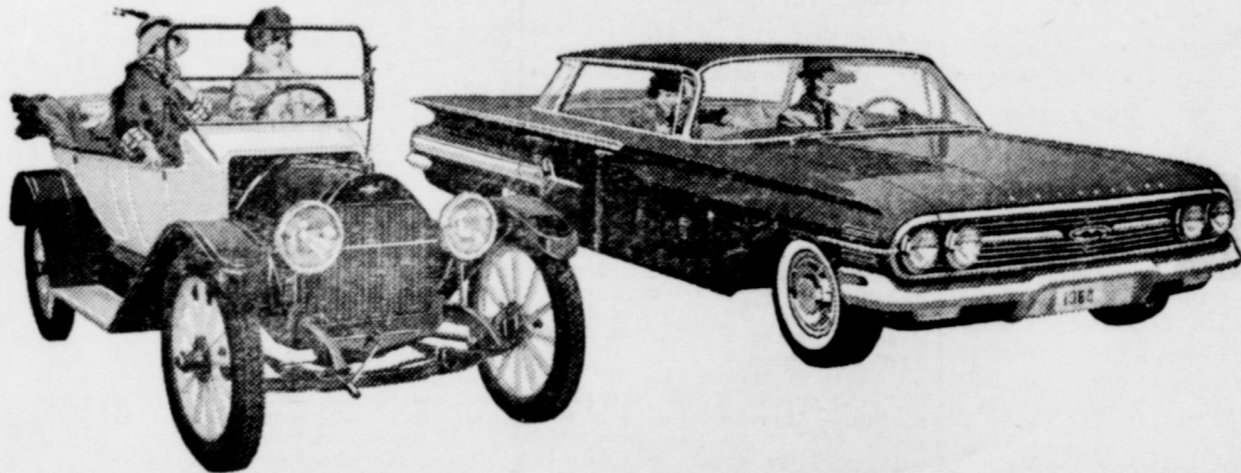

 ABLE PROPERTY IN SAID
 COUNTY AND WHO HAVE DULY
 RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAX-
 ATION:

TAKE NOTICE that an election
 will be held in Lynn County, Tex-
 as, on the 5th day of December,
 1959, on the proposition and at
 the places more particularly set
 forth in the election order passed
 by the Commissioners' Court on
 the 26th day of October, 1959,
 which is as follows:

"AN ORDER
 CALLING AN ELECTION ON
 THE PROPOSITION OF THE
 ISSUANCE OF \$190,000.00
 ROAD BONDS AND THE LEVY
 OF A TAX IN PAYMENT
 THEREOF.

WHEREAS, there has been
 presented for the consideration of
 the Court a petition signed by the
 requisite number of persons pray-
 ing that an election be held in
 Lynn County, Texas, on the pro-
 position of the issuance of Road
 Bonds of said County in the
 amount of \$190,000.00 and the
 levy of a tax in payment thereof,
 and

WHEREAS, the Court has
 found that said petition is signed
 by more than fifty (50) of the
 resident, qualified property tax-
 paying electors of Lynn County
 owning taxable property in said
 County and who have duly render-
 ed the same for taxation, and

WHEREAS the amount of bonds
 to be issued will not exceed one-
 fourth of the assessed valuation of
 the real property of said Lynn Co-
 unty.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED,
 ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY
 THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT
 OF LYNN COUNTY, TEXAS:

1. That an election be held in
 said County on the 5th day of Dec-
 ember, 1959, which is not less than
 thirty (30) days from the date of
 this order, to determine;

Whether or not the bonds of
 said Lynn County shall be issued in
 the amount of \$190,000.00, bearing
 interest at a rate not to exceed Four
 (4 percent) percent per annum, and
 maturing at such time as may be
 fixed by the Commissioners' Court,
 serially or otherwise, in not to ex-
 ceed Twenty (20) years from the
 date thereof, for the purpose of the
 construction, maintenance and op-
 eration of macadamized, graveled
 or paved roads and turnpikes or in
 aid thereof, throughout Lynn Co-
 unty, Texas; and whether or not

ad valorem taxes shall be levied an-
 nually on all taxable property in
 said County sufficient to pay the
 annual interest on said bonds and
 provide a sinking fund sufficient
 to pay the bonds at their maturity.

2. That said election shall be
 held under the provisions of Chap-
 ter 3, Title 22, Revised Statutes of
 1925, as amended by Chapter 16,
 Acts of the First Called Session of
 the 39th Legislature.

3. All persons who are legally
 qualified electors of this State and
 of this County, and who are resi-
 dent, qualified property taxpaying
 electors of this County, owning tax-
 able property in said County and
 who have duly rendered the same
 for taxation, shall be entitled to
 vote at said election, and all elect-
 ors shall vote in the election pre-
 cinct of their residence.

4. The ballots of said election
 shall have written or printed there-
 on the following:

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF ROAD
 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF
 AN AD VALOREM TAX IN PAY-
 MENT THEREOF"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF
 ROAD BONDS AND THE LEVY-
 ING OF AN AD VALOREM TAX
 IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

Each voter shall draw a line
 through one of the above expres-
 sions thus leaving the other as in-
 dicating his vote.

5. The said election shall be held
 at the several polling places in Lynn
 County, Texas, and the following
 named persons are hereby ap-
 pointed as Presiding Judges of said
 election. Said Presiding Judges are
 hereby authorized to select such
 assistants as may be required to
 assist them in holding said election
 at the several voting precincts as
 follows:

Voting Precinct No. 1 at the
 Home Demonstration Agents Office,
 Courthouse, Tahoka, Texas, with
 John F. Thomas as Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 2 at the
 High School Building, Wilson, Tex-
 as, with C. E. Campbell as Presid-
 ing Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 3 at the High
 School Building, O'Donnell, Texas,
 with Ralph Beach as Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 4 at the Com-
 munity Center, New Home, Texas,
 with Tom Russell as Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 5 at the
 Methodist Church, Draw Commu-
 nity, with Graham Hensley as Pres-
 iding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 6 at the Co-
 unty Courtroom, Courthouse, Tah-
 oka, Texas, with E. R. Edwards as
 Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 7 at the
 Schoolhouse, Grassland Commu-
 nity, with H. W. Edwards, Jr. as
 Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 8 at the Gin
 Office, Gordon Community with
 J. H. Huddleston as Presiding
 Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 9 at the High
 School Building, Tahoka, Texas,
 with Maurice Huffaker as Presiding
 Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 10 at the
 Community Center, New Moore
 Community, with N. S. Parker as
 Presiding Judge.

Voting Precinct No. 11 at the
 Gin Office, Lakeview Community,
 with B. G. Milliken as Presiding
 Judge.

 canvass the absentee votes to be
 cast at said election:

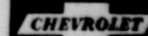

No. 1 Killer

During a recent conference devoted to orientation and experience for people in the field of heart disease, some interesting facts were discussed.

The Division of Cancer and Heart Diseases of the Texas State Department of Health revealed figures on the prevalence of the nation's number one killer.

In 1958 there were 25,042 deaths from heart disease in Texas.

Adding the 11,158 fatalities from vascular lesions (primarily strokes) equals a total of 36,200 deaths attributed to cardiovascular disease. Last year there were 73,443 deaths in Texas from all causes. This means that 49 per cent of all persons who died did so as a direct result of some cardiovascular condition.

To further dramatize the effect of this condition, subtract from the total deaths the number killed by accidents (5,214).

This leaves us with the cold fact that 52 per cent (well over half) of the persons who died from natural causes did so from cardiovascular disease.

Accurate information concerning the occurrence of the different types of heart disease in the population is not readily available.

It varies in different parts of the world and even in different parts of the United States and in different peoples or ethnic groups. However, Dr. Paul Dudley White's estimate is perhaps as good as any. (He was one of the specialists attending President Eisenhower.)

He found the occurrence of the different types of heart disease in 3,000 organic cases to be as follows:

Coronary heart disease accounted for 48 per cent, hypertensive

heart disease (high blood pressure) claimed 26 per cent, rheumatic heart disease took 23 per cent, congenital heart disease made up six per cent, and all the other types caused seven per cent of the deaths from cardiovascular disease.

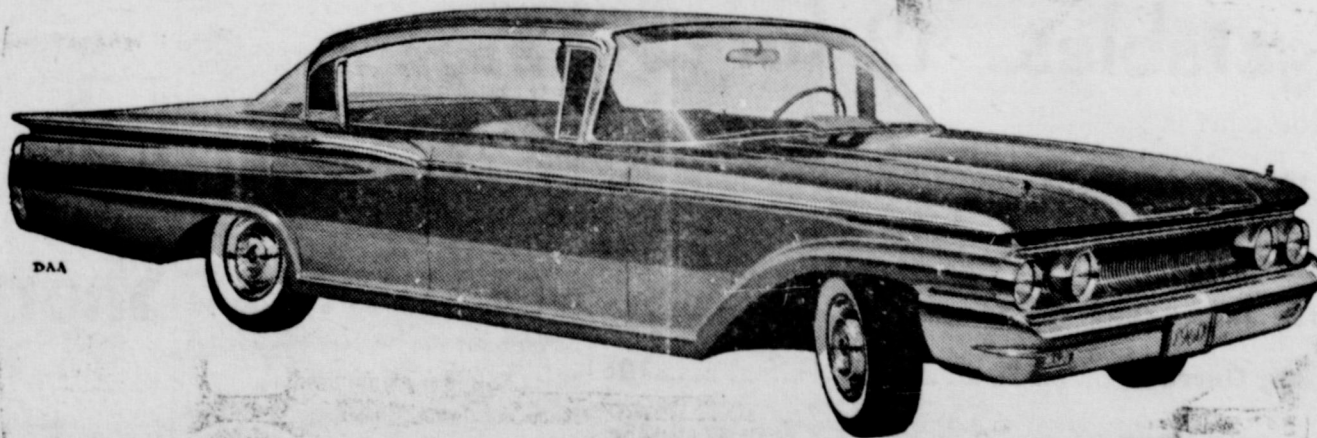

AT THE NORTH "Y"

Accurate information concerning the occurrence of the different types of heart disease in the population is not readily available.

It varies in different parts of the world and even in different parts of the United States and in different peoples or ethnic groups. However, Dr. Paul Dudley White's estimate is perhaps as good as any. (He was one of the specialists attending President Eisenhower.)

He found the occurrence of the different types of heart disease in 3,000 organic cases to be as follows:

Coronary heart disease accounted for 48 per cent, hypertensive heart disease (high blood pressure) claimed 26 per cent, rheumatic heart disease took 23 per cent, congenital heart disease made up six per cent, and all the other types caused seven per cent of the deaths from cardiovascular disease.

O'Donnell Rotarians will join with nearly half a million Rotarians in 114 countries for a special observance of the "Rotary Foundation Week." An adequate amount of good litter is an essential requirement for floor type poultry production. The cost of gambling on insufficient litter can be hazardous.

Plant breeders of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station have released a new cream pea, Texas Cream No. 8 which is adopted to all sections of Texas. It has many advantages over varieties now grown.

No. 1 Killer

During a recent conference devoted to orientation and experience for people in the field of heart disease, some interesting facts were discussed.

The Division of Cancer and Heart Diseases of the Texas State Department of Health revealed figures on the prevalence of the nation's number one killer.

In 1958 there were 25,042 deaths from heart disease in Texas. Adding the 11,158 fatalities from vascular lesions (primarily strokes) equals a total of 36,200 deaths attributed to cardiovascular disease.

Last year there were 73,443 deaths in Texas from all causes. This means that 49 per cent of all persons who died did so as a direct result of some cardiovascular condition.

To further dramatize the effect of this condition, subtract from the total deaths the number killed by accidents (5,314).

This leaves us with the cold fact that 52 per cent (well over half) of the persons who died from natural causes did so from cardiovascular disease.

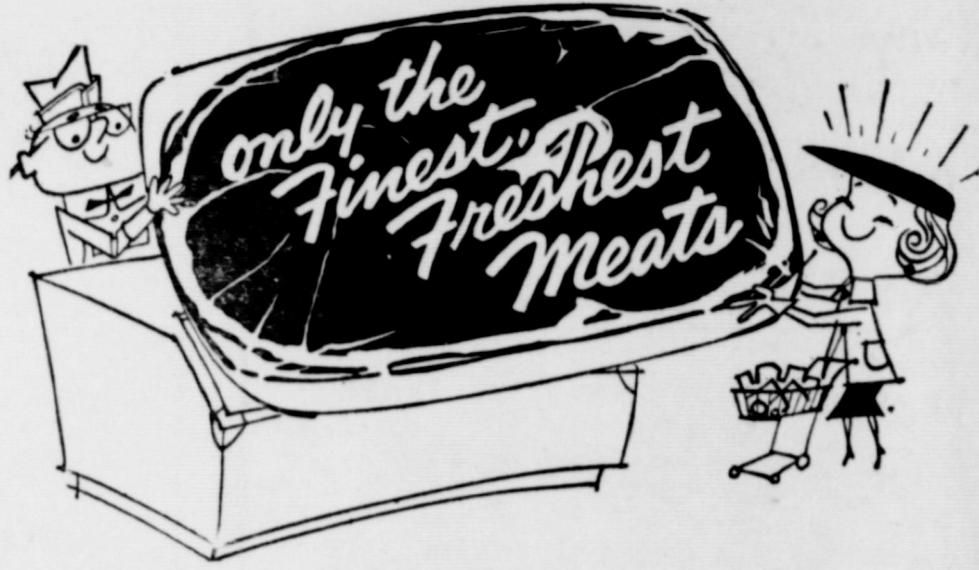
