It would be the duties of a publle nurse to visit each schoo in the county and give individual inspection of each pupil. filling in blank showing the condition o the child's health for the inspec tion of the parents and family physician and in case of a defect, the child can be treated. It is also the duties of a publle nurse to instruct the people on home sanitation, the source of many
diseases, also classes in home nursing and first aid to the injured will be formed and instructions given to girls between the ages of 11 to 15 . Mothers will be advised as to the proper care of children as to diet and defects of eyes, ears and throat. A public nurse is your nurse and my nurse and she will always be ready to respond to give her
skillful help in stamping out con. tagious diseases and giving her advice freely in preventing diseases.
Lynn county should have a public health nurse and each citizen should write the Commis. sioners Court and urge it to not let this opportunity pass of se-
curing the services of one.
