

#### Cement maker takes a leaf from cook book

PORTLAND CEMENT

Any expert cook knows that kneading is one of the most important parts of good bread-making-that it is the thorough mixing of the moist dough that makes her baking a real success. Otherwise, the pure, rich ingredients-even when baked in a perfect oven at the correct heat-will come out a poor, soggy loaf of bread.


