## BIRTH RECORD IMPORTANT

Can parents of an adopted child get a birth certificate for that child on which they are shown as the natural parents?

Yes, says State Registrar W. D. Carroll. Furthermore, the new birth record will bear no evidence of the adoption.

If the mother and father of an illegitimate child marry after birth, can a new birth record be issued showing the child to be legitimate? Again yes. These and other facts of life and death will get thorough going-over December 1-2 when city and county registration officials and vital statisticians gather in seminar at the Texas State Department of Health.

One of the most important items to be covered at the meeting will be the necessity for requiring complete documentation before amending a birth record. Without such documentation, Carroll says, birth records lose some of their value as evidence.

Birth certificates are routinely called for to prove a person's age, parentage, and citizenship. So confidential is the nature of vital registrations that all employees of Carroll's office are sworn to secrecy about the details of their daily work. Even discarded correspondence is specially burned, rather than being hauled away with regular trash collections.

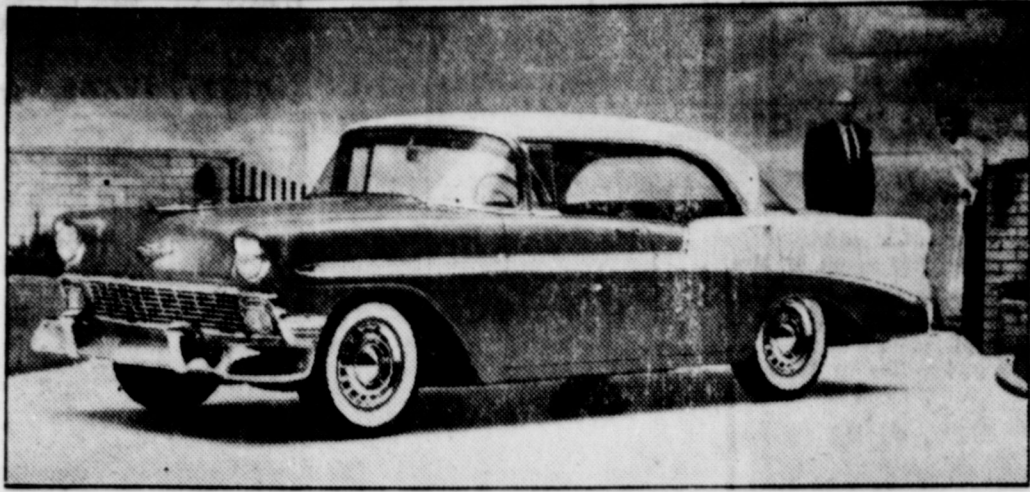

**Corn-Pepper Bake (Serves 6)**

- 6 large green peppers
- 4 slices bacon
- 1 egg
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 tablespoons finely diced onion
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 teaspoon sugar (optional)
- 1½ teaspoons salt
- 1½ cups milk, scalded
- 2 cups cooked corn
- ½ cup soft bread crumbs

Wash peppers, cut a slice from the side of each and remove seeds and fibrous parts. Cover with boiling water and simmer 5 minutes. Meanwhile cook bacon, drain and dice. Beat egg slightly. Melt butter, add onion and cook until tender. Add flour, sugar, seasonings and blend. Add milk and cook

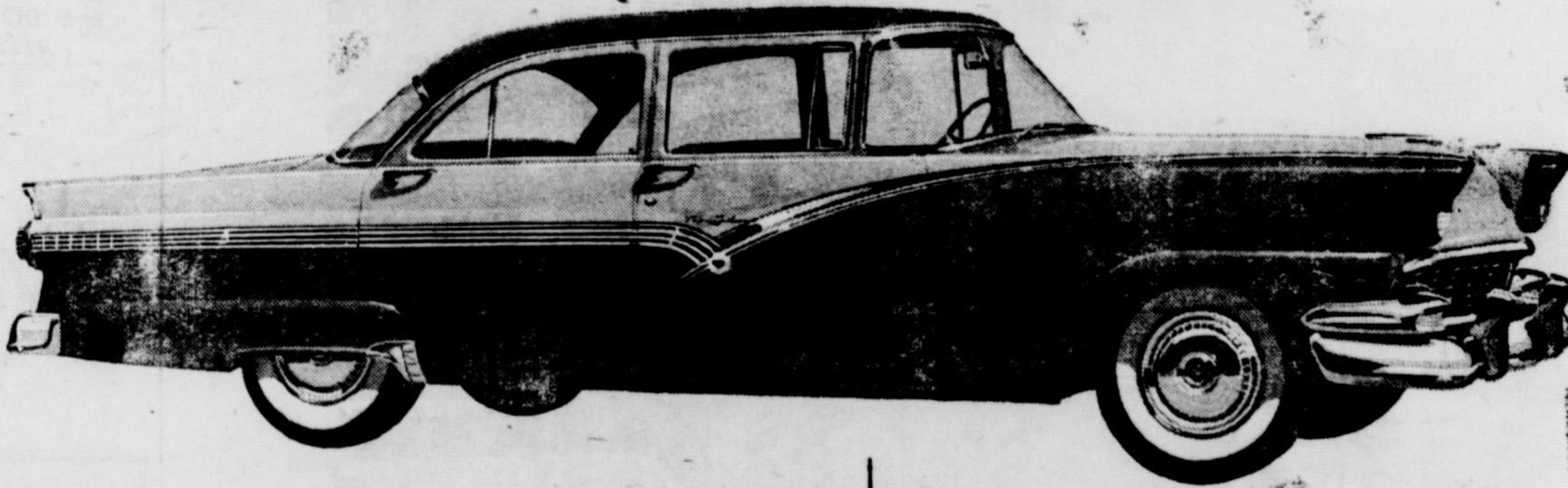
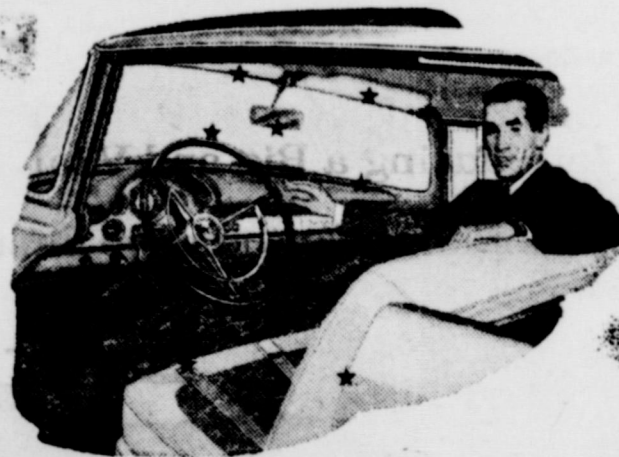

**VA Quiz**

Q -- I am drawing monthly disability compensation payments from VA, and I also am paying monthly premiums on my GI insurance. Would there be any way for VA to deduct enough money out of my compensation to take care of my insurance premiums, so that I wouldn't have to bother with them every month?

A -- Yes. So long as your disability compensation checks are large enough to cover your GI insurance premiums, you may apply to VA to have the premiums taken out of your compensation.

Q -- I am a Korean veteran and

I have just been discharged from service. I plan to apply for Korean GI term insurance within 120 days from my separation. Will I have to take a physical examination?

A -- No. A physical examination is not required. All you need do is file an application and pay your first premium -- within the 120 days after your separation.

Q -- If I buy a house with a GI loan, is the salesman's commission considered a part of the closing costs or a part of the purchase price of the house?

A -- The salesman's commission is considered as a part of the purchase price of the house. The sales price including the commission may not exceed the "reasonable value" as set by VA.

Q -- I understand a veteran's Korean GI training entitlement can be extended if it runs out when he is more than half-way through his semester at school. What about on-the-job training? Can entitlement be extended here too?

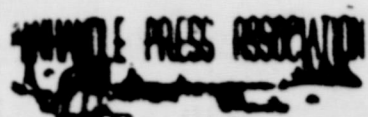
A -- No. GI training entitlement may not be extended for veterans taking on-the-job training.

**Tom Garrard Passes**

Tom Garrard, 75, prominent Texan, attorney and a citizen of Lynn County for 22 years died of a heart ailment in Tahoka hospital last Tuesday. Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at 3 p. m. in the Tahoka Church of Christ with the local minister, Doyle Keley officiating and burial was in Tahoka Cemetery. He was born near Cooper in Delta County, Tex., the son of an ex-Confederate soldier.

He graduated in law in 1907 from Texas U. He practiced law in Midland and served from 1914 to 1921 as district attorney of the Midland district there. In 1921 Gov. Pat Neff appointed him State's attorney for Court of Criminal Appeals and he lived in Austin until 1925. He was county judge of Lynn county for four years and during this time most of the farm to market roads were built. He was always a very good friend to O'Donnell and this area. The county has lost one of its most outstanding workers and citizens in Judge Tom. One of his sons, T. T., now of Seagraves, lived here for many years.
