### TWO MAIN TYPES OF APPENDICITIS

All of us at one time or another have pain and cramping in the abdomen. Fortunately, most of these pains are unimportant. However, if the pain persists it should not be ignored. It may be the beginning sign of appendicitis, a disease which, although far from being simple, is easily and safely cured. If surgery can be performed in time, says Dr. Henry Holte, Commissioner of Health.

There are two main types of appendicitis — acute and chronic. Acute appendicitis strikes suddenly and is usually marked by severe pain that generally grows sharper and stronger. Occasionally the pain may let up or stop entirely but this must not be taken to mean that the attack is over. In fact, it may be a warning signal that the appendix has ruptured, thus lessening the localized pain, while a more serious condition, peritonitis usually gets a start. Other usual signs of acute appendicitis are slight fever, nausea, vomiting and tenderness over region of the appendix. Chronic appendicitis is just what the name implies; it comes and goes. But it may, at any time, become acute. It results from acute attacks that have been mild enough to subside without an operation. Symptoms in general are the same as in the acute type but they are also similar to other adverse abdominal conditions.

### MAHON SAYS '57 COTTON ACRES TO BE SAME AS '56

Congressman George Mahon of the 19th District advised from his office in Lubbock this week that he has received information from the Department of Agriculture in Washington indicating that the cotton acreage allotments in West Texas will be about the same in each county as in 1956.

An additional large shift in acreage from West Texas to East Texas is not contemplated, Mahon is planned that each Texas county will get not less than 95 percent of its 1956 allotment. Under the plan most West Texas counties should get slightly more acreage than in 1956.

The Department of Agriculture has approved a compromise plan which had been submitted by the State ASC Committee which will allow the State Committee to hold from the State allotment a small farm of 15 acres or less for hardship cases and all other than small farms 2 1/2 percent will be withheld. West Texas farmers and farm groups had asked that not more than two (2) percent be withheld for other than small farms. The total amount withheld for all purposes will be about 6 3/4ths percent of the State allotment. Mahon said, "I had hoped with other West Texas in an effort to keep the withheld acreage to the lowest possible figure, I think the efforts helped because an additional large shift of acreage out of West Texas in 1957 is not now contemplated. However the compromise plan still gives the edge to the small farm areas of East Texas."

Broiler placements continue at or near record levels. By mid-September about 75 million broiler chicks had been placed on Texas farms this year as against 61 million for the same period in 1955 — an increase of 23 percent. For the 22 major producing states placements for the period were up 20 percent. Texas poultry marketing experts believe that before a price recovery can be made, production will have to be pulled more nearly in line with demands.

**SOWING AND REAPING**

There are many factors that determine, to a large extent, the outcome of a farmer's labors; and many of these factors are beyond his control. However, there are two laws that govern completely the results of his labor, and over these he has absolute control. The first of these laws state: "Whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." The farmer is well acquainted with this law, and he knows that he must plant cotton seed if he is to reap a crop of cotton. The second law states: "He that soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly." The farmer is also well acquainted with this law. He knows that too few seed will result in a poor harvest; therefore, he plants as many seed per acre as the fertility of his soil will permit. He does not limit his harvest by sowing an insufficient amount of seed.

These laws of nature are easily understood by everyone, however, many people fail to realize that these laws are also operative in the spiritual realm. Paul states: "He that soweth unto his own flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth unto the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap eternal life." (Gal. 6:8) The law of sowing and reaping in the spiritual realm is just as immutable as the law of sowing and reaping in the natural realm. We reap what we sow. Many professing Christians sow continually unto the flesh, and some of them are actually expecting to reap the fruit of the Spirit from the seed of fleshly desire. Such a thing is as impossible as reaping corn from cucumber seed! If we expect to reap the fruit of the Spirit, we must sow the kind of seed that will bring forth that fruit.
