## Dangerous Malady

What the Russians stand for has lately come under heavy attack from almost every group and individual in America. We are almost unanimous. Current Congressional investigations at last seem to be hitting pay dirt. Russia herself, by strangling little Czechoslovakia and conducting the "cold war," has been losing some of her friends. Influential Communists are deserting, once they see what Russia's "ideologies" really are like.

### In Our Generation

No matter by what name you call it, state control has grown in almost every country you can name. This has happened in our generation. After World War I, politicians in many nations sensed their opportunities for power. Usually, this power was obtained through economic tyranny. Heavy taxes, false money, and tinkering with production and distribution kept the tyranny in power. Finally, it was Germany, Italy, and Japan that brought on another terrible war.

They were the "statist" nations. In each of these nations aggression against other countries followed aggression against the individual at home. Little nations, weakened by statism of their own, were easy victims. When their people did not care to resist and nothing seemed worthwhile, totalitarianism could find easy pickings. Now, statist Russia continues this sorry business.

### Recognize the Infection

The infection of statism is at its worst in Russia, but we have not escaped it in America. We cannot always call it Communism, for unfortunately it does not always wear the name. Yet its effects are unmistakable. It demoralizes everything. Those in government can then justify a growing hunger for more and more power. Statesmen lose their vision to become mere politicians. They come to believe that the state can do everything.

The citizen is demoralized by statism. He gets to the point where he does not resist inroads on his liberties. He becomes a slave of the state. He is willing to follow evil courses no matter whether his heart tells him they are wrong. Resistance is simply not worthwhile. This is an exact picture of the German people before and during World Wars I and II. It fits also the Italians and the Japanese in World War II.

### America's Danger

The picture fits Russia, too. It is the statist, government-controlled countries that soon take their people down the road to war. Nations do not foment wars when the people have a say-so. The greatest danger in America today is that we shall adopt one by one the ways of statism, even while denouncing Communism. This is what Russia would like to see us do. Instead, we must learn to identify the infection, no matter what label it may carry.

One label we are learning to avoid is Communism, but our understanding of it is usually pretty sketchy. Read and study "Communism in Action," a 140-page booklet, prepared by the Library of Congress. Copies may be obtained free from: American Wage Earners Foundation, 30 N. La Salle St., Chicago, Ill. This is a factual study that will show the results of statism in Russia. It will convince you that neither you nor America could be better off under government managed economy.

**PROCLAMATION**  
BY THE  
**Governor of the State of Texas**

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME

WHEREAS, farming and ranching activities in Texas afford the principal income of a vast majority of its inhabitants; and, WHEREAS, the farming and ranching business is one of the leading industries of Texas; and, WHEREAS, the farmers and ranchers of Texas have, through their various organizations, crusaded for recognition, representation, and economic equality through democratic procedures; and, WHEREAS, the farm and ranch groups recognize the necessity and supreme importance of having an educated, prosperous, and organized agricultural husbandry in this State:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Beauford H. Jester, Governor of Texas, do hereby proclaim the week of October 21 - 28, 1948, as TEXAS FARM BUREAU FEDERATION ORGANIZATION WEEK

I urge our citizens to cooperate in the recognition and observance of this week so that special attention can be given this important phase of our Texas life.

If a flock of Leghorn hens were to go househunting, they would look for just about the same comforts as their human prototypes.

Sufficient space, good ventilation, uniform temperatures, a sturdy foundation and floors are a few of the recommendations for housing the birds, according to suggestions in a revised extension bulletin on "Poultry Housing" issued by the University of Minnesota.

Like all construction, building a poultry house is an expensive proposition. As it is difficult to correct mistakes after the building is up, flock owners are advised to consider their problem and needs carefully before starting construction.

**Community Nests for Poultry House Advise Installation Decreases Number of Dirty Eggs**

Taking cognizance of the premium prices paid for clean eggs on market, poultrymen with large flocks are giving increased attention to installation of community nests.

Dirty eggs brought 15 cents a dozen than clean eggs when through Ohio cooperative egg stations in June, D. D. Moyer, specialist in poultry husbandry at Ohio State university, points out, adds that the owner of a large laying flock either has to take a cut in price, spend almost as much cleaning eggs as in all other cases of the laying flock or change

poultry house equipment to reduce the number of dirty eggs gathered. Installation of community nests in place of the small box type decrease the number of dirty eggs by 50 per cent, Moyer claims. They are easier to clean and can be kept free from parasites more easily than the ordinary little cubical. Original construction cost also considerably less than that of equal amount of nesting space the old type inasmuch as less labor and material are required.

The community nest recommended by the Ohio station is 8 feet long, 2 feet wide, 14 inches high in front and 30 inches high in back. The space is divided in the center where there are 2 4-foot compartments the nest, providing facilities for 100 laying hens. The front half of the nest cover is hinged so it can be lifted for gathering eggs. The bottom of the nest can be hinged so it will swing down to dump nest litter. Hens enter the nest from the front in the center of each compartment.

Materials required for construction include: 9 pieces of 1-inch 8-inch by 8-inch for lid, front, top ends and partition; 3 pieces of 1-inch by 10-inch by 8-inch for ends and back; 1 piece of 1-inch by 10-inch by 8-inch for lower front board; 4 pieces of 1-inch by 4-inch by 10-inch for cleats, nest perch and trance lids; 1 piece of 1-inch by 10-inch by 8-inch for cleats for ends and partition; 1 piece of 1-inch by 4-inch by 10-inch for top supports, with the piece nailed at the ends if hinged; 3 pieces of 8-inch strap hinges, and 3 8-inch hooks and screw eyes if the bottom is hinged.

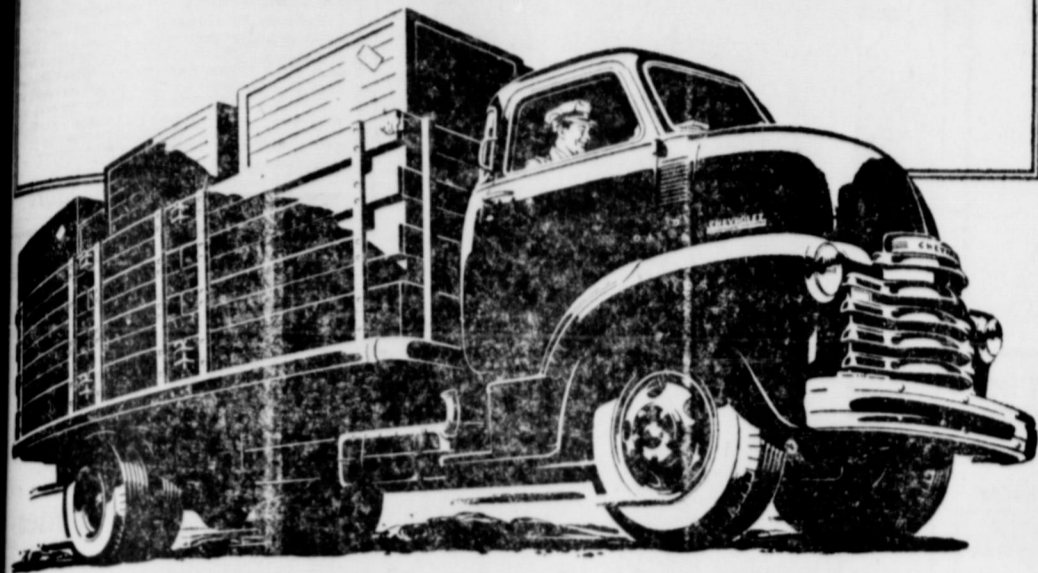

### Efficient Fertilizer Use Boosts Yields

Good Soil Management Must Aid Plant Food

Every ton of fertilizer can be stretched or used more efficiently, boosting crop yields at the same time. Many farmers, says Middle West Soil Improvement committee, use fertilizer as a crutch. They try to make it substitute for good management practices. They put plant food in the soil without making sure the plant can send out its roots to use it.

Fertilizer is essential in giving the soil plant nutrients to feed crops. But fertilizer can't do the whole job. It must be teamed with other practices that build and maintain soil structure and keep the top soil "nailed down."

The soil needs good structure so roots can grow and reach out for plant food. Roots need air and water to live. When a soil is packed down and tight, there is no room for the air and water needed by roots and plants for high crop production.

The way to build soil structure is to grow legumes and grasses regularly in the rotation. These legumes make a thick layer of good soil.

YOU CAN S-T-R-E-T-C-H YOUR FERTILIZER



They add organic matter. Such soil has plenty of air space. Water soaks in quickly and more of it is held.

Weak, scattered stands of legumes won't build soil structure. For strong, leafy stands and vigorous roots, the legumes need phosphate and potash that can be added in commercial fertilizer. Getting thick stands isn't the whole story either. All these crops can't be cut for hay or graze close and still be expected to build the soil. At least a part of these crops must be turned back to the soil.
