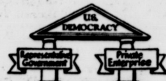

**WHAT'S WRONG WITH DEMOCRACY?** In discussing this question recently, Paul Garrett, Director of Public Relations for General Motors, found nothing wrong with our democracy except, perhaps, a lack of understanding of the things it stands for. Man longs to know that through and through the plan of American enterprise is threaded his greatest hope for the future." 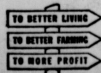
