More pickers are coming and with continued good weath r it. is expected that the gins will be kept busy during the next two months. Mr. Busby estimates the crop will reach between 18, 000 and 20,000 bales.

Owing to the recent showers and damp weather, the buyers state that the staple has greatly deteriorated the past week. The price has been running from 21 cents to 22 75.
