New S. S. Setup Given

More than 100,000 disabled workers all over the Nation have been notified that they are entitled to social security disability insurance benefits and will receive their first ed on following days.

In making this announcement, Mr. Hutton noted that action is betaken as speedily as possible on all disability applications and that many other disabled workers, who not yet have received notice of final action on their applications, will be receiving their first checks in coming months. No further action is necessary on their part, he said.

All disabled workers who meet the requirements of the law, and whose applications have been filed with their social security offices before the end of December 1957. Mr. Hutton said, will get benefit payments for the months of July through December, After December payments cannot be made for any month before the month of application.

In order to get disability insurance benefits, a person must be be-tween 50 and 65 years of age and must have a long-lasting disability so severe that he is not able to engage in any substantial gainful activity. He must have worked uncontinued on back page

most important species which enter House flies develop prolifically in animal excrements, although any warm, moist organic material will support some breeding. The length of time from egg to adult is dependent upon such factors as availability of food and the temperature During summer eggs hatch in 8-12 hours; the larvae feed for 5-8 days;

and 2-3 days are spent in the pupal or resting stage. In Texas, fly breeding occures throughout the year, although at a reduced rate during the winter in the northern half of

House flies five for a month or two during warm weather and for longer periods during winter if protection from extreme cold is found. Adult house flies have been shown to be capable of flying 10-12 miles but are believed to do so if favorable breeding sites are more acces-

Fly control is the responsibility of private citizens as well as cities. It is essentially a matter of maintaining adequate sanitary conditions, with the use of insecticides being strictly a supplementary measure. Chemicals are of doubtful value in abating flies when they are produced in enormous quantities in favorable breeding media.

Homeowners should strive to prevent fly breeding on their property or holding oderiferous materials which attract flies bred elsewhere. Metal garbage cans with tight lids should be used. Compost piles should be checked regularly to insure that flies are not breed-(cont'd on back page





ing, and fly-tight doors and screens should be maintained. The organic phosphates, especially malathion, are now widely used in fly control. A 2 per cent solution of malathion may be spread around garbage cans or other attractions. Commercially prepared aits used malathion are available for use in areas of adult fly concen-tration. Space sprayes of pyrethrins are sometimes useful in knocking down adult flies in homes when they are present in numbers. Caution—
