

farm work. A small flock can bring in additional income, help clean up odd corners about the farm, and use roughage.

The same amount of pasture is needed for five ewes and their lambs, as for one cow and calf. A cow needs a half-acre of hay during the winter-a ewe needs about onequarter acre. The carrying capacity of a good alfalfa-brome pasture is around five ewes and their lambs per acre.

What will it cost to go into the sheep business? Compared to beef, the cost is lower. For instance, beef cow will cost from \$300 to \$375. One calf from this cow per year will be worth about \$160. Five ewes will cost anywhere from \$125 to \$200. Five ewes probably will give you seven lambs worth about \$170.
