Bible Thought: "... whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with him."

(I Thessalonians 5:10)

Several years ago there was an English play in which one character slept from the beginning until the end. It was a play concerned with crucial social issues, and off to one side of the stage sat this sleeping character -- a preacher! He spoke not a word during the entire performance.
