# Requests to be made for photovoltaic systems on school rooftops

Dallas- Central and South West Services, Inc. (CSWS), on behalf of West Texas Utilities Company (WTU), Central Power and Light Company (CPL) and Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO), will issue on Aug. 7 a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the procurement of up to 160 kilowatts of new photovoltaic resources. All of the companies are owned and operated by Central and South West Corporation (NYSE: CSR).

The RFP calls for individual systems of four kilowatts each to be located on the roofs of up to 40 separate schools in the WTU, CPL and SWEPCO service territories. Following approval of the contracts, which is anticipated by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) in June 1998, up to eight photovoltaic systems will be installed in WTU's service territory and 16 each in CPL and SWEPCO's territories. The CSW electric operating companies and the during three Deliverable

the schools following approval of the contract by the PUCT. The photovoltaic installations are planned to begin commercial operation no later than June 1, 1999.

The CSW companies are requiring photovoltaic monitoring and display equipment to be provided and maintained at each of the schools for ongoing educational purposes. Students at the schools will have the opportunity to learn how photovoltaic systems convert sunlight to electricity. As part of its program to educate the public about renewable energy, CSW also plans to offer a traveling trailer that will demonstrate renewable energy technol-

The photovoltaic resource RFP is being issued as a part of CSW's Integrated Resource Plan, which was filed with the PUCT in January. An energy resource mix that included renewable resources was strongly advocated by customers winning bidder will select Polls™ held last year at

each of the three CSW Texas electric operating companies. In conjunction with the Integrated Resource Plan, and RFP for the procurement of up to 75 megawatts of renewable energy resources also

was issued in May. "Issuance of this RFP further illustrates our commitment to responding to the customer feedback during the deliberative poll," said Floyd Nickerson, president of West Texas Utilities Company. "Customers indicated that they wanted renewable energy to be a part of our energy resource mix and we are meeting that commitment through the RFP for 75-megawatts of renewable energy. The Aug. 7 RFP responds to customers' desire for greater education about renewable energy technology,"

Nickerson said. Bidders for the Aug. 7 photovoltaic resource RFP will own and maintain the roottop systems, which will be leased by the CSW electric operating companies at a fixed monthly fee for a lease term of between

> Two-Thirds Fail Algebra I Final results on the Algebra I

test released by the Texas Education Agency showed that 35 percent of the 236,852 students who took the exam in the spring passed. The figure represented an im-

provement over last year — the first year of the test -- when 28 percent passed the Algebra I test.

Students performed much better on Biology I, the other major end-of-course exam as 78 percent passed. That was up 2 percentage points from last year.

"Student performance is improving. That is a positive sign," said state Education Commissioner Mike Moses.

But he acknowledged that Algebra I is a concern for teachers across the state. "That is unsatisfactory," Dr. Moses said. "We must do a better job working with our teachers and in staff develop-

In a strongly worded letter, all 17 of the state's Democratic members of Congress said Gramm's opposition on political grounds to former Tarrant County Judge Michael Schattman was "unacceptable." Republican Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison also opposes the nomination of Schattman, a Democrat.

Gramm's spokesman, Larry Neal said the senator is opposed to the nomination in part because Schattman has long been active in party politics.

Schattman, who attended Georgetown University with President Clinton, was first nominated for a seat on the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas in

#### Give Her A Hand, But Save The Applause

Dear Readers: The phrase, "Let me give you a going to receive. The silicone liner will allow her to do hand" is a fairly common expression. But when it's used in a literal context, it's rather unique. Allow me to introduce you to Brett Ellison. She's an exceptionally bright, talented 12 year old girl who plays the cello. Nothing uncommon about that. Many 12 year olds play musical instruments, but only a few do so with a prosthetic arm. Brett was born with only a partial left arm-missing the hand and forearm up to the elbow.

If you were to meet Brett, you would quickly note that she doesn't see herself as being different from people who have all their limbs intact. Her body image is fantastic. In fact, Brett chooses to wear her prosthetic arm only when she's playing the cello. For that she needs to have two hands-one to finger the notes on the strings and the other to draw the bow. For playing baseball or soccer she doesn't bother with harnessing on her prosthesis.

So far what I've described is a healthy-both physically and emotionally-12 year old girl. What makes Brett different from other children her age is that all of New York City fell in love with this child. While recently being picked up from a music recital practice by a friend, Brett lost her prosthetic arm. Apparently between the friend's bags, Brett's cello and her arm-all of which were stowed in the taxi cab's trunk-the arm was left behind and not noticed missing until late that evening. Upon hearing of the mishap, Brett's music teacher, Laura Esptein, got the ball rolling by contacting the media. Within hours, Mayor Giuliani stepped up to the plate and a plea was made to 44,000 cab drivers to search their trunks for the missing limb. The limb was never recovered despite the \$5,000 reward money | offered.

I began this column by using the phrase, "Let me give you a hand" and that's exactly what the Kessler Institute for Rehabilitation located in Livingston, New Jersey has done for Brett. According to their head prosthesist, Jack Hodgins, it's quite a limb that Brett is

without the harness that was previously needed to keep the prosthesis in place. The hand grip force will equal that of a human hand, and overall, cosmetically it looks good. This new limb looks so natural that Brett may opt to wear it for more than just playing the cello.

Brett Ellison is a special girl, not because she wears a prosthesis and plays the cello, but because she found favor with the media. And because the Kessler Institute so generously donated Brett's new arm, I've earmarked \$15,000 of my money so another child, who isn't as fortunate as Brett, may receive the prosthesis which will allow him or her to achieve whatever dreams pursued. Who knows, maybe it will be the arm for a child whose ambition is to be an orchestra conductor-the very one from whom Brett takes her cue.

Dear Percy Ross: H-E-L-P! This sometimes nasty four letter word is really my own personal acronym. "H" stands for Helen (that's me). "E" stands for Everybody needs a little help at least once in their life. "L" stands for loan, because I'd be willing to take the money I need in the form of a loan, and "P" stands for please, please, please be my guardian angel, if only for the moment. **BORROWING FROM YOUR** 401(K) - PART ONE

You've built up a nice nestegg in your company's 401(k) plan, but now you need cash, perhaps for college tuition or a new car. One option is to borrow from your 401(k) account. But before you do, make sure you understand the tax consequences.


First, here are some 401(k) tax basics. Your 401(k) contributions are made with pre-tax dollars, and the earnings on your account accumulate free of tax. Withdrawals are taxed as ordinary income and, unless you're over age 59 1/2, a 10% penalty usually applies. However, you can access up to half your funds (\$50,000 maximum) tax-free if the plan allows 401(k) loans. To qualify, the loan must be paid back within five years (longer if it is to buy a home), and payments must be in equal installments at least quarterly. Your plan may impose other conditions, especially if you are an officer, owner, or key employee. The interest rate usually compares favorably with alternatives such as car or home equity loans.

There are two main tax issues to consider. First, eventhough the interest you pay goes into your own account, you'll be taxed twice on it. That's because you'll make loan payments with after-tax earnings and then pay taxes again when you eventually withdraw funds at retirement. Interest payments on a 401(k) loan are virtually never deductible. They would only be deductible if the 401(k) loan was secured by a mortgage on a principal residence or second home, which would be too complex to administer for most

A bigger concern is that if you resign or lose your job, most plans require you to repay the loan in full. If you can't come up with the money, your loan will be taxed as a distribution and the additional 10% penalty will apply if you're under retirement age. You should only consider a 401(k) loan if you feel secure in your job or have alternative sources of cash if needed.
