Larry Young reached first when he was hit at bat, Deakins reached base on an error, and Holcomb was hit by a pitch. Bryan Cullen was the 3rd Clyde man to get hit by the pitcher, then Ricky Winters and Rex

Walker followed with singles to bring in the runs.

The Clyde All Stars are to be commended for their play and sportsmanship. They advanced to bi-district play-off in Iowa Park and were defeated 9-1 Monday night. This is only the second time Clyde has advanced this far. This is a fine group of athletes and they will go far in the future. Both years the team was coached by Gerald Holcomb.

Coach Holcomb will hang up his Little League hat this year, and advance to a higher league next year. He completed 12 years of coaching in Pee Wee and Little League, and has had a number of 1st place teams during that time.

Reserve Seat Sales To Start Monday

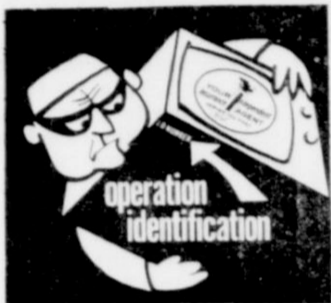

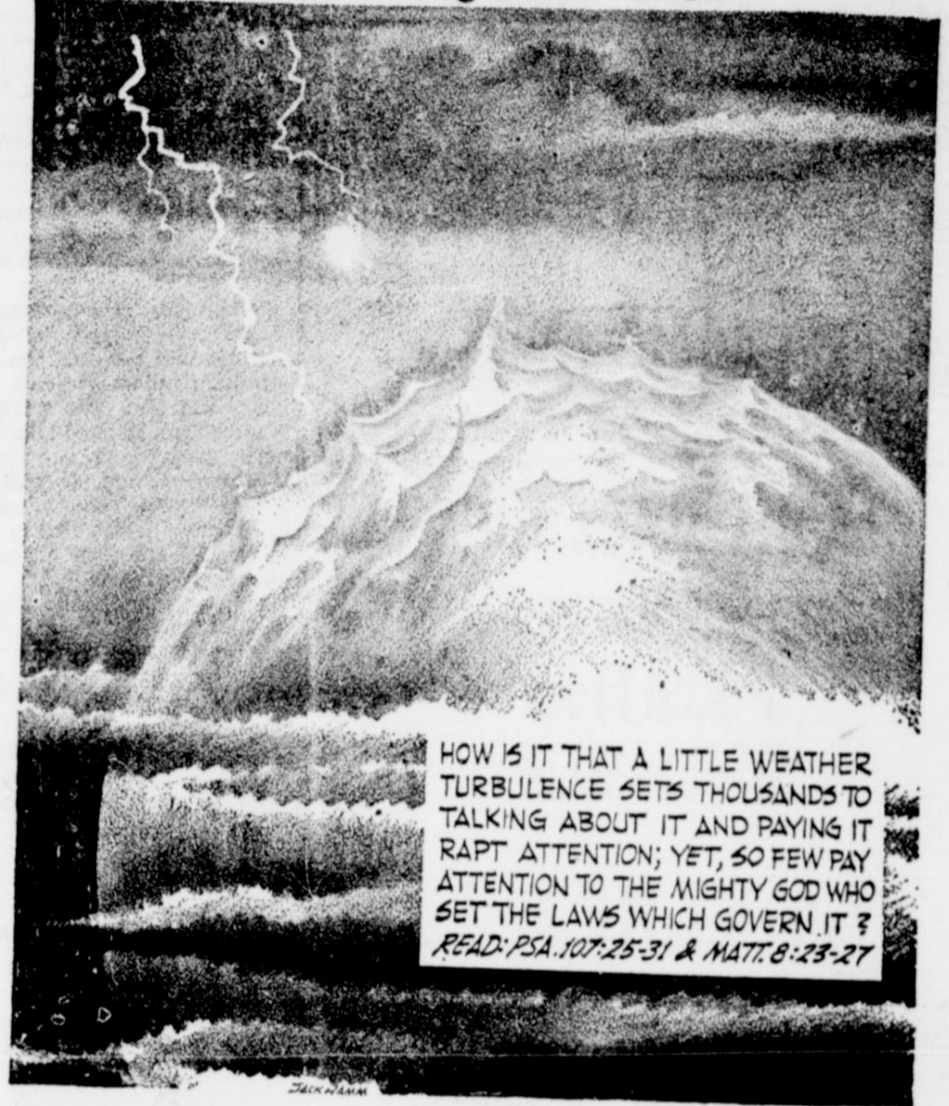
