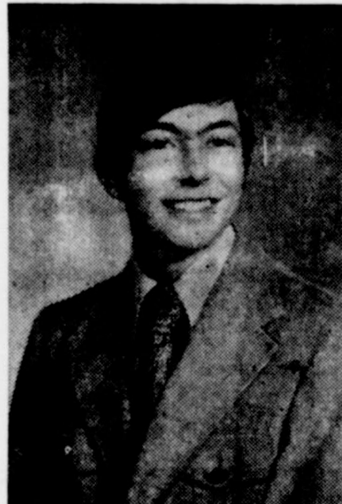

'THE UNPARDONABLE SIN'

We have rented and are remodeling the "OLD PLAZA THEATER" on Market Street in Baird, Texas, and will begin services there on the first Sunday in September.

There are many people who have their own version as to what the Unpardonable Sin is. For our authority for this question we must go to the Bible, there we find the correct answer.

In Matthew 12:31, 32, also Mark 3:28, 29, we are told about "THE UNPARDONABLE SIN", a sin for which there is no forgiveness in this life, nor in the life to come. A sin which when committed seals a person's doom for eternal torment in Hells Fire. I think we can better discover what this sin is, if we first discover what it is not.

IT IS NOT ADULTERY: let me say that Adultery is a horrible and heinous sin and one that God certainly judges and punishes, but it is not the "UNPARDONABLE SIN." We know that because men like DAVID, The woman taken in the act of Adultery and many others, came to Jesus and were forgiven of their sins.

Look in your Bible to John 3:18 and you will see "HE THAT BELIEVETH NOT IS CONDEMNED ALREADY, BECAUSE HE HATH NOT BELIEVED IN THE NAME OF THE ONLY BEGOTTEN SON OF GOD." If you still have doubts read PSALMS 9:17, also PROVERBS 1:23-29, also JOHN 3:36.

Farmers and Ranchers Can Still Qualify for Predator Program

Farmers and ranchers who missed the Callahan County training meeting on the use of the M-44 spring-loaded ejector which uses sodium cyanide capsules will have an additional opportunity to qualify for the program.

Nine meetings will be conducted within the 44 counties of the experimental program area. Farmers and ranchers may attend any of the meetings to be qualified.

Only those individuals who participate in a training meeting will be qualified to purchase and use the M-44 and sodium cyanide capsules in the pilot program. Each participant will be issued a certificate by the Texas Department of Agriculture at the conclusion of the meeting.

The meeting will concern the safe use of the M-44 spring-loaded ejector which uses sodium cyanide capsules as a means of controlling predatory animals. The device has been approved by the Environmental Protection Agency for use in a 15-month experimental program in 44 counties in West, Central and South Texas. The Texas Department of Agriculture will direct the program. Cooperating agencies are the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Texas Rodent & Predatory Control Service. The aim of the program is to determine the safest, least expensive and most effective means of controlling predators without harm to other wildlife and the environment.

ACC Football Season Tickets Now On Sale in Baird and Clyde

BAIRD — David Strickland of Baird and John Holtz of Clyde have been named football season ticket representatives for Abilene Christian College, Wally Bullington, ACC athletic director announced.

Strickland will coordinate ACC football season ticket sales in Baird, as Holtz will in Clyde.

"We had good support last year from people in towns and cities near Abilene," Bullington said. "But we believe there are others who will enjoy Wildcat football also. We'll be an exciting team to watch again this fall."

Season tickets to the five ACC home games in 1974 are \$3 each for adults, \$5 each for students and \$2.50 each for children under 12.

Abilene Christian won Lone Star Conference and NAIA national Division I championships with an 11-1 record in 1973. Bullington, ACC head football coach, will welcome back 25 lettermen, including 1973 freshman all-America running back Wilbert Montgomery and 14 other starters.

ACC plays its home games in Shotwell Stadium in southeast Abilene. The five 1974 games in Abilene are: University of Nebraska at Omaha, Sept. 21, at 7:30 p. m.; Southwest Texas State, Oct. 5, 7:30; East Texas State, Oct. 19, 2 p. m. (ACC homecoming); Angelo Star on Nov. 2 at 7:30 (ACC high school day); and Tarleton State, Nov. 9 at 7:30.

ACC is undefeated in Shotwell Stadium since Nov. 2, 1972, and averaged 40.5 points per game in Shotwell in 1973.

School begins Monday, August 19th, and scrimmages have been scheduled with Albany and Ballinger on August 23 and 30, respectively.

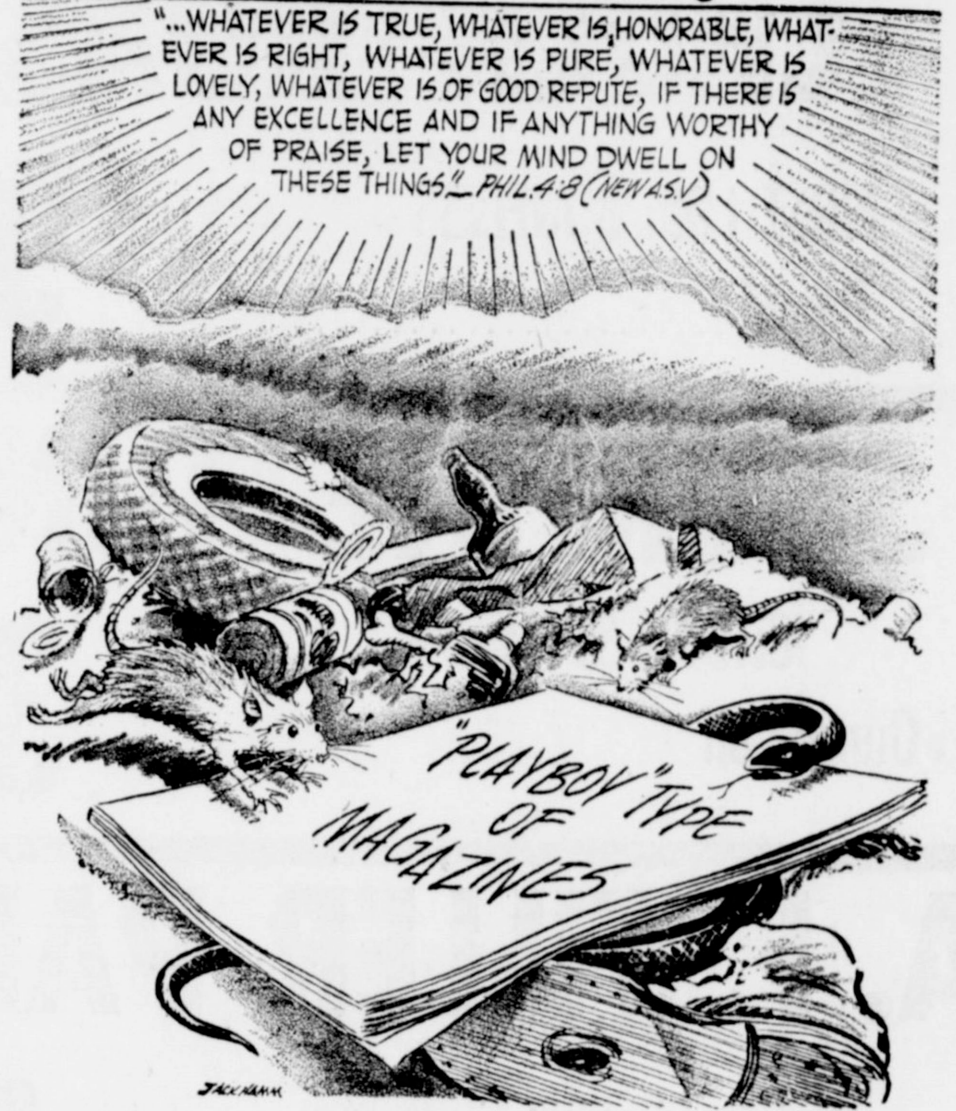
