"The Little Minister," a novel by James Barrie, tells the story of Gavin Dishart, a young minister who is called to the church in the Scottish village of Thrums. Though thrilled with the problems before him, in the back of his mind was the fear his height would stand against him; for he was a short lad.

The book goes on to relate how he conquered his height and won over the strong-minded people of the village. In describing the little minister, Barrie says, "Though short of stature he cast a great shadow."

These are words for our times: we must cast a great shadow. If you were to meet yourself for the first time today, what would be your first impression? More important, as you got to know you, how would you be influenced?

It is a startling and yet quite obvious thing that each one of us, especially when we do not know it, is an example to someone else. It was the light of the Father's love combined with the person of Jesus that created the greatest shadow.

And then the shadow of the empty Cross spreads itself over all history; that Cross touches you and me right now.

Let us face the challenge to be leaders today, now, with our influence; to cast the positive shadow of a redeemed life. God's sun is waiting to shine upon your life. How great will be the shadow?

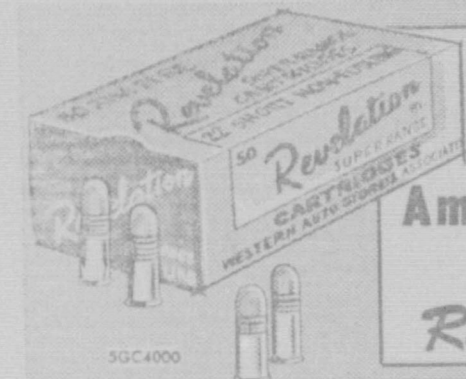

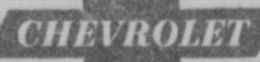

election all ballots shall have printed thereon the following: "FOR the Amendment to Section 49-b of Article III of the Constitution of Texas by adding the resale of lands of the Veterans Land Fund remaining unsold after having been first offered for sale to veterans to such purchasers, in such quantities, and on such terms, and at such prices and rates of interest, and under such rules and regulations as are now provided by law or as may hereafter be provided by law."





## Sketches of Our Churches

Rev. Robert C. Dawkins of the Highland Church of God in Wichita Falls will be speaker on the evening the Church of God is responsible for filling the pulpit. He has preached in Iowa Park several times and has been in pastoral work nine years. He is a graduate of Lee college, Cleveland, Tenn.

Mr. Dawkins has worked extensively in evangelistic work for six years. He has conducted a number of radio programs and is in charge of "Echoes of Faith" over KNIN.

Iowa Park Church of God was organized in 1929 by the late Mr. and Mrs. V. E. Wilson. Present membership is 135. Steve Brown is Sunday School superintendent. Rev. C. E. Prince has been called as minister of the church here and will be on the field the first Sunday in September.

Assembly of God of Iowa Park had its beginning in 1951. In the 11 years J. V. Morton has been Sunday School superintendent and Mrs. Jim Fish has been church secretary. Others have served continuously as teachers.

A new educational building was erected in 1960 and average attendance in Sunday school is about 75. One mark of growth is that attendance this year has not on any Sunday been as low as last year's average.

Rev. H. E. Allen has been pastor for three years. He has been preaching 25 years and has been pastor of seven churches. Among the neighboring churches he has pastored are those at Byers and Burk Burnett and Archer City.

Allen has for the past two years served as presbyter of Wichita Falls section with 34 churches and 70 ministers and missionaries.

On March 14, 1890, a small group of folk met in the school building in the south part of town and organized the First Missionary Baptist Church of Christ in Iowa Park. On March 14, 1865, this congregation is due to celebrate the 75th anniversary of this church.

The present building was erect-

ed in 1925. In 1957 the Children's building was constructed at a cost of some \$45,000. The building is year around air conditioned, and it was filled to near capacity shortly after it was put in use.

Present resident church membership is 642. Sunday school enrollment is 631, and average attendance in 1962 is 327.

The church has no indebtedness and there is about \$30,000 in the building fund in cash and assets. The church gives 26 percent of all undesignated gifts to world missions outside the Association. Present church budget is about \$50,000 per year. Since January 1, 1962, 50 persons have united with the church.

Rev. Homer W. Thompson has served First Baptist church as pastor for the past six and one-half years. He is a graduate of Baylor university and Southern Baptist Seminary with a master of theology. Presently he is serving on the executive board of Texas Baptists, the District 11 board, Wichita-Archer Association board. He is a member of the District 11 camp committee and is a trustee of the camp.

Mr. Thompson saw service in World War II as a chaplain in the 95th Infantry Division.

## July Accidents

Highway Patrol investigated 18 rural accidents in Wichita county during July. Ten persons were injured and property damage is estimated at \$8,430.

First six months of 1962 there were 104 rural traffic accidents resulting in 4 persons killed and 62 injured. Property damage totaled \$53,911.

Familiar yellow school buses will soon be back on our highways. Sgt. E. L. Stroud, patrol supervisor of this area, reminds motorists of the state law relating to school buses:

"The driver of a vehicle upon a highway outside the limits of any incorporated city or town, upon meeting or overtaking from either direction any school bus which has stopped on the highway for the purpose of receiving or discharging any school children, shall stop the vehicle immediately before passing the school bus, but may then proceed past such school bus at a speed which is prudent, not exceeding 10 miles per hour, and with due caution for the safety of such children."

## Study Club Will Honor Youth

In keeping with the theme for the year, "Accent on Youth," the Twenty-three Study club has adopted the High School Teenager of the Year project. One of the purposes of the project is to focus attention on the admirable characteristics and accomplishments of youth. 
