Tanner Funeral Home to Have Openhouse Sunday

Tanner Funeral Home, 300 E. Cash, has undergone extensive remodeling and a new chapel has been added. The home is now one of the most modern in the area. Openhouse will be held Sunday, Dec. 8, from 1:30 to 5:30. The structure was erected under supervision of Carl Sullivan, contractor, and covers 7,767 square feet with 2,342 feet of covered driveway for family use.

The funeral home consists of a foyer, business office with a drive-in window for payment of insurance premiums, a reception room, conference room, three slumber rooms, operating room, a 40 by 40 display room, two lounges two spacious halls for convenience in movement and achieving privacy in any part of the building. The chapel is done in natural cherry panelling like the funeral home, and has a seating capacity of 300. The family room has a private entrance and is separated by louvered panels. The minister's and musicians' rooms also have private entrances. The floor is covered with beige vinyl and carpeting. The pews in blending color have foam nylon seats with maroon-colored padding. The organ and piano are concealed, and the minister's chair is a custom-made Gilliam.

One of the most impressive features of the chapel is the foyer where a large mural of the Lord's Supper hangs above a Kameo Crema-Marble console. A large lighted cross, a part of the west wall of the chapel, adds significance and solemnity to the building.

The funeral home is tastefully furnished in walnut, fruitwood and maple. Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Tanner, owners and funeral directors, have tried to achieve a homey atmosphere in the reception room. Permanent arrangements, handiwork of Mrs. George Burkett of Altus, Okla., sister of Mrs. Tanner, enhance the beauty of the home throughout.

R. A. (Buddy) Tanner is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Tanner, pioneer residents of the area. His father was a funeral director in Iowa Park and owned

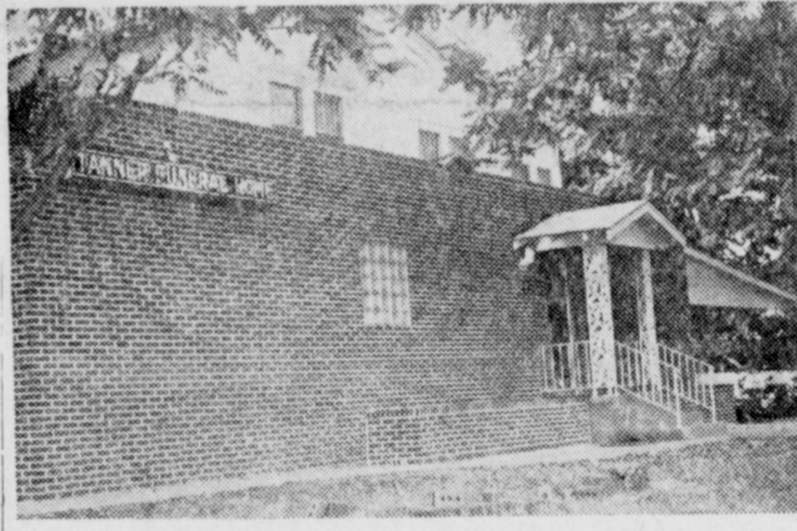
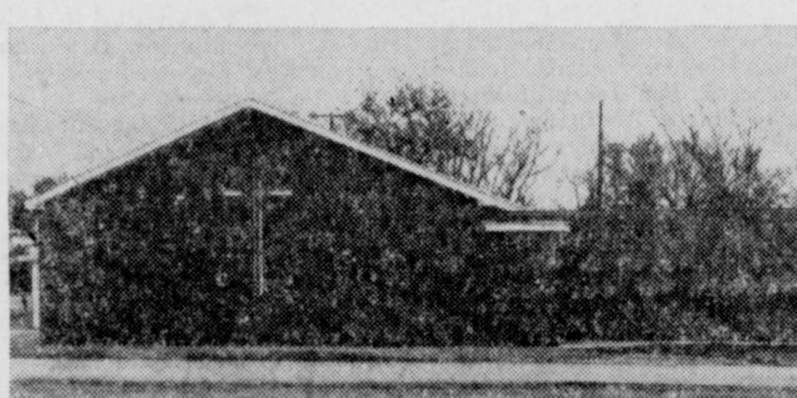
Tanner Hardware for many years. Buddy is a graduate of IPHS. He attended Baylor university at Waco. He is a graduate of Cincinnati School of Embalming, where he was offered a job as supervisor. He was also invited to go to New York City as supervisor of a funeral home. He has been a funeral director in Iowa Park since 1930.

Tanner is a member of the Noon Lions club which he has served as president. He belongs to A.F.&A.M. and is past patron of the Order of the Eastern Star. He belongs to the York Bodies, and is past commander of Wichita Falls Commandery 59. He is a member of the volunteer fire department which he served as chief for several years. He has served as president of the Chamber of Commerce the Texas-Oklahoma Fair, and as city alderman.

Mrs. Tanner is a lady of many talents. She was born in Altus, Okla., and was graduated from Mineral Wells high school. She received the B.A. degree from North Texas State Teachers college at Denton. She came to Iowa Park in 1928 to teach Spanish and English in high school. She was married to R. A. Tanner in 1930 and continued to teach until 1933, when she resigned to become associated with her husband in the hardware and furniture business. She served as bookkeeper and buyer for the giftware department.

She resumed teaching in 1942 during the teacher shortage in World War 2, but resigned later due to ill health of her mother. During the time she was out of the classroom she received her master's degree from Midwestern university, and her funeral director's license.

Mrs. Tanner rejoined the school faculty in 1954, teaching at first in junior high and later English and Spanish in high school. She recently resigned to give full time to the work of the funeral home. Mrs. Tanner taught a Sunday school class in First Baptist church for many years. She was at one time assistant organist of the church. She is a past worthy matron of O.E.S. and past president



of the Beaumont, Wichita Falls, Epsilon Sigma Alpha sorority, and she is past president of Twenty-three Study club, helped organize many years.



Dr. and Mrs. Aubrey Kelso and Children Killed in Airplane Crash

The whole community was saddened and shocked when word came that Dr. and Mrs. Aubrey Kelso and their two children—Melinda and Kent—of Perryton were killed when the light plane in which they were riding crashed during a rain about 15 miles north of San Saba at 4:45 Wednesday afternoon, Nov. 27.

They were enroute to Nixon to spend the Thanksgiving holidays with Aubrey's parents Mr. and Mrs. M. T. Kelso.

Mrs. Kelso, the former Miss Betty Denny, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Earle Denny. She was granddaughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. L. C. Denny and the late Tom Mitchell and Mrs. Sue Mitchell of Iowa Park, all pioneer residents of this area.

Betty was graduated from Iowa Park and was a popular member of the younger set. She was active in the work of the First Baptist church here. She received a BA degree from Baylor university, Waco.

Aubrey was also a graduate of Baylor university and of Baylor school of dentistry at Dallas. The couple had lived in Perryton for nine years, where Aubrey was a well known dentist.

Mrs. Kelso, 34, was a teacher in the Sunday school's junior department and Sunbeam director in First Baptist church of Perry-

ton at the time of death. Dr. Kelso, 33, was associate superintendent of Sunday school and member of many church committees. Melinda, 9, and Kent, 6, were both members of the church.

Funeral services were conducted in the Baptist church here Saturday afternoon with Rev. Edgar Jones of the Perryton church officiating. He was assisted by Rev. Homer W. Thompson. Burial was in Highland cemetery under direction of Tanner Funeral Home.
